individual forms of explanation often percolate. In this perspective explanation is seen as the task fulfilled by the teacher with students passively receiving what is presented. Collecting feedback on students' perceptions of whether explanations are clearly identified whether students feel particular teaching assisted them in understanding the subject matter. Without student understanding no explanation can be said to be clear. We see explanation in a much broader sense. Communication in school is a mutual interchange of information among teachers and students; students and students during the educational process, i.e. students have an active role in the whole process. Mares K. Ivohlav, 1995. Using explanation in a mathematics classroom is a normal procedure but its roles and forms vary. Predominantly explanation is seen as a tool for describing relevant phenomena, developing students' logical thinking and guiding students by inductive judgement to generalizing.
