and geneticists Morphological characterization and analysis of hereditary trends of human material have already had a long history and recently detailed analysis of genetic material has become feasible in the wake of rapid development in our knowledge of the oncoviruses oncogenes suppressor genes chromosomal and DNA mapping molecular mutation and so on It is true that in colorectal pathology and in no other field these areas of research have been explored more extensively and decisively The identification of previously ill defined lesions such as precancers and benign neoplasms have been improved because sequential changes can be observed in multiple samples spread over a wide area and followed up in due course
