delinquents In addition to the interplay between gender ideals and the eugenics movement Zipf also investigates the girls who were housed at Samarcand and those specifically charged in the 1931 trial She explores their negotiation of Jazz Age stereotypes their strategies of resistance and their relationship with defense attorney Nell Battle Lewis during the trial The resultant policy changes intelligence testing sterilization and parole are also explored providing further insight into why these young women preferred prison to reformatories A fascinating story that grapples with gender bias sexuality science and the justice system all within the context of the Great Depression era South Bad Girls at Samarcand makes a compelling contribution to multiple fields of study Interzones Kevin J.
