practicing psychiatrist and psychoanalyst Young probes Bergman's relationships with his parents his wives his children and his colleagues to explore the meanings of his many films As Bergman gradually began to work through his psychological problems he accomplished something that few people have ever done he analyzed himself The films examined in this study include the majority of his features including *The Seventh Seal* *Wild Strawberries* *The Virgin Spring* *Through a Glass Darkly* *The Hour of the Wolf* *The Passion of Anna* *Cries and Whispers* *Face to Face* *Autumn Sonata* *Fanny and Alexander* and *Persona* Young also draws upon recorded interviews and Bergman's autobiographical novels to provide further insight into the director's creative process While many books have been written about Bergman and analysts have studied particular films this volume represents a unique approach to understanding an artist through his art *The Persona of Ingmar Bergman* will appeal to film and art students as well as those in the psychotherapy profession and of course the director's fans throughout the world

Ingmar Bergman's *The Silence* Maaret Koskinen, 2011-07-01 Ingmar Bergman's 1963 film *The Silence* was made at a point in his career when his stature as one of the great art film directors allowed him to push beyond the boundaries of what was acceptable to censorship boards in Sweden and the United States The film's depiction of sexuality was as Judith Crist wrote at the time in the *New York Herald Tribune* not for the prudish Yet Bergman's notebooks and screenplays reveal his tendency for self censorship both to dampen the literary quality of his screenwriting and to alter portions of the script that Bergman ultimately deemed too provocative Maaret Koskinen a professor of cinema studies and film critic for Sweden's largest national daily newspaper was the first scholar given access to Bergman's private papers during the last years of his life Bergman's notebooks reveal the difficulties he experienced in writing for the medium of moving images and his meditations on the relationship or its lack between moving images and the spoken or written word Koskinen's attention to this intermedial framework is anchored in a close reading of the film focusing on the many faceted relationships between images and dialogue music sound and silence *The Silence* offers filmgoers an entryway into the cinematic cultural and sociopolitical issues of its time but remains a classic rich enough for scrutiny from a variety of perspectives and methodologies Koskinen draws a picture of Bergman that challenges the traditional view of him as an auteur revealing his attempts to overcome his own image as a creator of serious art films by making his work relevant to a new generation of filmgoers Her exploration of the film touches on issues of censorship and the cinema of small nations while shedding new light on the shifting views of Bergman and auteurist film high art and popular culture

Contemporary Italian Filmmaking Manuela Gieri, 1995-01-01 Contemporary Italian Filmmaking is an innovative critique of Italian filmmaking in the aftermath of World War II as it moves beyond traditional categories such as genre film and auteur cinema Manuela Gieri demonstrates that Luigi Pirandello's revolutionary concept of humour was integral to the development of a counter tradition in Italian filmmaking that she defines humoristic She delineates a Pirandellian genealogy in Italian cinema literature and culture through her examination of the works of Federico Fellini Ettore Scola and many directors of the new generation such as Nanni Moretti Gabriele Salvatores Maurizio Nichetti and Giuseppe Tornatore A celebrated figure of the theatrical world Luigi Pirandello 1867-1936 is little known beyond Italy for his critical and theoretical writings on cinema and for his screenplays Gieri brings to her reading of Pirandello's work the critical parameters offered by psychoanalysis poststructuralism and postmodernism to develop a syncretic and transcultural vision of the history of Italian cinema She identifies two fundamental trends of development in this tradition the melodramatic imagination and the humoristic or comic imagination With her focus on the humoristic imagination Gieri describes a Pirandellian mode derived from his revolutionary utterances on the cinema and narrative and specifically from his essay on humour *L'umorismo* On Humour 1908 She traces a history of the Pirandellian mode in cinema and investigates its characteristics demonstrating the original nature of Italian filmmaking that is particularly indebted to Pirandello's interpretation of humour Dreams, Doubt, and Dread Zachary Thomas Settle, Taylor Worley, 2016-08-24 Films are modern spiritual phenomena They function as such in at least three profound ways world projection thought experiments and catharsis i.e. as dreams doubt and dread Understanding film in this way allows for a theological account of the experience that speaks to the religious possibilities of film that far extend the portrayal of religious themes or content *Dreams Doubt and Dread The Spiritual in Film* aims to address films as spiritual experiences This collection of short essays and dialogues examines films phenomenologically through the experience of the viewer as an agent having been acted upon in the functioning of the film itself Authors were invited to take one of the main themes and creatively consider how film in their experiences has provided opportunities for new modes of thinking Contributors will then engaged one another in a dialogue about the similarities and differences in their descriptions of film as spiritual phenomena The intended aim of this text is to shift contemporary theological film engagement away from a simple mode of analysis in which theological concepts are simply read into the film itself and begin to let films speak for themselves as profoundly spiritual experiences
