Mr. Kamiar Mohaddes, Mr. Mehdi Raissi, 2014-12-15 This paper examines the long run relationship between consumer price index industrial workers CPI IW inflation and GDP growth in India We collect data on a sample of 14 Indian states over the period 1989 2013 and use the cross sectionally augmented distributed lag CSDL approach of Chudik et al 2013 as well as the standard panel ARDL method for estimation to account for cross state heterogeneity and dependence dynamics and feedback effects Our findings suggest that on average there is a negative long run relationship between inflation and economic growth in India We also find statistically significant inflation growth threshold effects in the case of states with persistently elevated inflation rates of above 5.5 percent This suggests the need for the Reserve Bank of India to balance the short term growth-inflation trade off in light of the long term negative effects on growth of persistently high inflation Financial Liberalization P.
