equal parts appliance and scientific instrument a device that by modifying how heat and air moved through indoor spaces might reveal the workings of the atmosphere outside and explain why it seemed to be changing With his stove Franklin became America's first climate scientist Joyce E Chaplin's *The Franklin Stove* is the story of this singular invention and a revelatory new look at the Founding Father we thought we knew We follow Franklin as he promotes his stove in Britain and France while corresponding with the various experimenters who discovered the key gases in Earth's atmosphere invented steam engines and tried to clean up sooty urban air During his travels back and forth across the Atlantic we witness him taking measurements of the gulf stream and observing the cooling effect of volcanic ash from Iceland And back in Philadelphia we watch him hawk his invention while sparring with proponents of the popular theory that clearcutting forests would lead to warmer winters by reducing the amount of shade cover on the surface of the Earth As the story of the Franklin stove shows it's not so easy to engineer our way out of a climate crisis with this book Chaplin reveals how that challenge is as old as the United States itself
