short lived theory that denied the conservation of energy at the quantum level and climactically over the new quantum mechanics that Bohr enthusiastically embraced and Einstein stubbornly defied This contest of visions stripped the scientific imagination naked Einstein was a staunch realist demanding to know the physical reasons behind physical events At odds with this approach was Bohr s more pragmatic perspective that favored theories that worked even if he might not have a corresponding explanation of the underlying reality Powerful and illuminating Einstein Defiant is the first book to capture the soul and the science that inspired this dramatic duel revealing the personalities and the passions and in the end what was at stake for the world
