The Last Modernist Andrew Horton, 1997-08-07 This new collection of essays including contributions from David Bordwell and Fredric Jameson surveys Angelopoulos entire cinematic output and presents an intelligent and articulate discussion of his major films themes and concerns The authors argue that Angelopoulos sustained oeuvre has kept alive the tradition of postwar modernism the cinema of Antonioni Jancso and Ozu in the largely hostile climate of the 1980s and 1990s

The Films of Theo Angelopoulos Andrew Horton, 2016 Greek film director Theo Angelopoulos is one of the most influential and widely respected filmmakers in the world today yet his films are still largely unknown to the American public In the first book in English to focus on Angelopoulos s unique cinematic vision Andrew Horton provides an illuminating contextual study that attempts to demonstrate the quintessentially Greek nature of the director s work Horton situates the director in the context of over 3 000 years of Greek culture and history Somewhat like Andrei Tarkovsky in Russia or Antonioni in Italy Angelopoulos has used cinema to explore the history and individual identities of his culture With such far reaching influences as Greek myth ancient tragedy and epic Byzantine iconography and ceremony Greek and Balkan history modern Greek pop culture including bouzouki music shadow puppet theater and the Greek music hall tradition Angelopoulos emerges as an original thinker with the camera and a distinctive director who is bound to make a lasting contribution to the art form In a series of films including *The Travelling Players* *Voyage to Cythera* *Landscape in the Mist* *The Suspended Step of the Stork* and most recently in *Ulysses Gaze* starring Harvey Keitel winner of the 1995 Cannes Film Festival Grand Prix Angelopoulos has developed a remarkable cinematic style characterized by carefully composed scenes and an enormous number of extended long shots In an age of ever decreasing attention spans Angelopoulos offers a cinema of contemplation

Adamopoulou,2024-04-01 Was migration to Germany a blessing or a curse The main argument of this book is that the Greek state conceived labor migration as a traineeship into Europeanization with its shiny varnish of progress Jumping on a fully packed train to West Germany meant leaving the past behind However the tensed Cold War realities left no space for illusions specters of the Nazi past and the Greek Civil War still haunted them all Adopting a transnational approach this monograph retargets attention to the sending state by exploring how the Greek Gastarbeiter s welfare was intrinsically connected with their homeland through its exercise of long distance nationalism Apart from its fresh take in postwar migration the book also addresses methodological challenges in creative ways The narrative alternates between the macro and the micro level including subnational and transnational actors and integrating a diverse set of primary sources and voices Avoiding the trap of exceptionalism it contextualizes the Greek case in the Mediterranean and Southeast European experience Cinematic Modernism and Contemporary Film Howard Finn,2022-10-06 Cinema was the most important new artistic medium of the twentieth century and modernism was the most important new aesthetic movement across the arts in the twentieth century However what exactly is the relationship between cinema and modernism Cinematic Modernism and Contemporary Film explores how in the early twentieth century cinema came to be seen as one of the new technologies which epitomised modernity and how cinema itself reflected ideas hopes and fears concerning modern life Howard Finn examines the emergence of a new international style of cinema combining a poetic aesthetic of the image with genre based fictional narrative and documentary realism He provides concise accounts of how theorists such as Andr Bazin Siegfried Kracauer Gilles Deleuze and Jacques Rancie re have discussed this cinematic aesthetic clarifying debates over terms such as realism classical and avant garde as well as recent controversies over terms such as slow cinema and vernacular modernism He further argues the influence of modernism through close readings of many contemporary films including films by Abbas Kiarostami B la Tarr Jia Zhangke and Angela Schanelec Drawing on a broad range of examples including Soviet montage Italian neorealism postwar new waves and the new cinema of Taiwan and Iran this book explores the cultural significance of modernism and its lasting influence over cinema *Byzantine and Modern Greek Studies* ,2000 **The New Biographical Dictionary of Film** David Thomson,2010 Thomson independent scholar writing of The Biographical Dictionary of Film aka A Biographical Dictionary of the Cinema 1975 edition described it as a personal opinionated and obsessive biographical dictionary of the cinema Thirty five years and several editions later that description still holds true of this expanded work The new dictionary summarizes salient facts about its subjects lives and discusses their film credits in terms of the quality of the filmmakers work In ambition it has competitors including Leslie Halliwell s various editions of Halliwell s Filmgoers Companion 12th ed 1997 and Halliwell s Who s Who in the Movies edited by John Walker 4th ed rev and updated 2006 which cover films and technical terms categories not included in Thomson s but whose entries are neutral and exceedingly brief Additionally Francophile Richard Roud s edited Cinema A Critical Dictionary The Major Filmmakers 2 v 1980 is as passionate

a work as Thomson's but narrower in scope with entries written by various experts rather than only by Roud. Finally the multivolume magnum opus *The International Dictionary of Films and Filmmakers* 4th ed 2000 ed by T Pendergast and S Pendergast 2nd ed ed by N Thomas v 1 CH May 91 1st ed ed by C Lyon v 1 2 CH Jan 85 v 3 CH Apr 87 v 4 5 CH Jun 88 covers everything films directors actors writers and production artists with generous measured scholarly entries and lavish illustrations. However it looms large and heavy unlike the handy one volume work by Thomson. Arguably Thomson's work for its scope is the most fun the most convenient and the most engaging title. All libraries supporting people interested in film should buy it. It will get lots of use and provide very good value for the money. Summing Up: Highly recommended.
