Stamper, 1991-08-27 Since its opening in the 1920s Chicago s North Michigan Avenue has been one of the city s most prestigious commercial corridors lined by some of its most architecturally distinctive business residential and hotel buildings Planned by Daniel Burnham in 1909 the avenue became

the principal connecting link between downtown and the wealthy residential Gold Coast north of the Loop. Some thirty buildings were constructed along its path in the ten year period before the Depression, an urban expansion comparable in significance to that of Pennsylvania and Park Avenues. John W.
