Romancero viejo María De los Hitos Hurtado, 1997 En la memoria colectiva de los pueblos siempre encontramos que de una manera o de otra las gentes han reflejado su historia en canciones y poemas transmitidos oralmente a lo largo de los siglos Estos textos los romances como forma más popular nos permiten conocer no sólo a los héroes del pasado a los que protagonizaron los hechos más destacados sino que también nos acercan a los sentimientos y a la vida de la gente común expresados con una frescura que aún hoy sorprende a sus lectores El romance tal como nos ha llegado es una forma literaria en la que se cruzan distintos géneros pico narrativo lírico y dramático En este volumen se recogen variadas y escogidas muestras de nuestro más tradicional romancero viejo los amores y desdichas de don Rodrigo los presagios de doña Alda los trabajos del Cid o las cuitas de un prisionero El Romancero Viejo Varios, 2012-10-29 Los romances viejos fueron compuestos y difundidos oralmente lo que hace muy difícil fijar su cronología Se les clasifica en tres grandes grupos Históricos nacidos al arrimo de un suceso de renombre contienen un propósito político inmediato Son los más fáciles de datar picos procedentes de un cantar de gesta o de otra fuente ya elaborada literariamente Novelescos o de aventuras vinculados a un inmenso repertorio internacional de leyendas y relatos La métrica del romance está muy próxima a la de la pica versos asonantes de dieciséis sílabas con cesura muy clara que los resuelve en dos octosílabos No aparecen por escrito hasta la segunda mitad del siglo XV cuando los poetas cortesanos comienzan a interesarse por este género popular On the Ethos of the "Romancero Viejo" C.
