Section 6 contains chapters on therapeutic approaches to psychological distress related to complex childhood trauma, dialectical behaviour therapy for borderline personality disorder, radically open dialectical behaviour therapy for over-controlled presentations, and schema therapy. Each of the chapters on clinical problems explains how to assess and treat the condition in an evidence-based way, with reference to case material. Interventions from cognitive-behavioural, psychodynamic, interpersonal, systemic, and biomedical approaches are described where there is evidence that they are effective for the problem in question.
