argues that Heston revitalized conservatism in general his image of morality individualism and masculinity lent the conservative movement credibility with a larger public He effectively campaigned for conservative candidates and causes using his popularity and image to fuel and legitimize his political activities Heston s high degree of political engagement not only paved the way for many of today s Hollywood activists but also helped popularize many of the beliefs of the neoconservative movement A balanced look at Heston and his offscreen work From My Cold Dead Hands explains how this charismatic man of conviction propelled his personal beliefs into the political mainstream of America
