- Spinul nerver One of the 31 pairs of nerves that originate on the spinul cord from posterior and autotion roots.
- Spinal shock A period from several days to several weeks following transection of the spinal cord that is characterized by the abolition of all reflex activity.
- Spinotholamic (spi-eo-tha-LAM-ik) tract Sensory (ascending) tract that conveys information up the spinal cord to the thalamus for senations of pain, temperature, itch, and tickle.
- Spinness (SPI-ness) process A sharp or thornfile process or proportion. Also called a spine. A sharp right restning diagonally across the postetion surface of the scapula.
- Spiral organ. The organ of hearing, consisting of supporting cells and hair cells that rest on the hasilat recombinate and extend into the endolymph of the cochlear duct. Also called the organ of Corti (KOR 181).
- Splanchnic (SPLANK-nik) Portaining to the
- Spleen (SPLEN) Large mass of lymphatic tissue between the familias of the stomach and the diaphragm that functions in formation of blood cells during early letal development, plagocytosis of suptured blood cells, and proliferation of B cells during immuner responses.
- Spongy (cancellous) bone thouse Bone tissue that consists of an irregular latticework of thin plates of bone called trabecular; spaces between trabecular of some bones are filled with red bone marrow. Jound inside short, that, and irregular bones and in the applyings (ends) of long bones.
- Sprain Forcible wrenching or twisting of a joint with partial rapture or other injury to its attachments without dislocation.
- Squamous (SKWA-mas) Flat or scalelike.
- Starvation (star-VA-shan) The loss of energy stores in the form of glycogen, triglycerides, and proteins that to introdequate intuke of nutricents or inability to digest, absorb, or metabolics ingested matricents.
- Static equilibrium (d-kwi-LBB-rd-ram) The maintetrance of posture in response to changes in the orientation of the body, mainly the head, relative to the ground.
- Stellate reticuloradothelial (STEL-3: re-tik-4-inen-sit-THE-40-all refl Plagocytic cell bandering a visuasid of the liver. Also called a **Kopffer** (KOOP-5cc) cells.
- Stem will An importalized well that has the ability to divide for indefinite periods and give rise to a specialized well.
- Steposis (sten-O-sis) An abnormal narrowing or constriction of a duct or opening.
- Stetoscilla (atc'-el-b-SIL-d-a) Googs of entremely long, slender, momentie unicovally projecting from spelledul cells luning the spididymin.
- Sterile (STE-ril) Free from any living microorganisms. Unable to conceine or produce officeing.
- Sterillization (stor'+-15-ZA-shun) Elimination of all living microorganisms. Any procedure that nenders an individual incapable of reproduction (for example, castration, vascetomy, hystorectomy, or confidence toward).

- Stimulus Any stress that changes a controlled condition; any change in the internal or external environment that enaites a sensory receptor, a neuros, or a muscle fiber.
- Stomach The I-shaped enlargement of the gastrointestinal tract directly inferior to the displacages in the opiguater, unifolical, and left bepochooding regions of the abdomen, between the evopluque, and small insperior.
- Straight turbule (TOO-bill) A dust in a testic leading from a convoluted seminiferous tubule to the rete
- Structuum (STRA-tuen) A laven
- Stratum basalis (to SAL in) The layer of the endometrium next to the myometrium that is maintained during menormation and gestation and produces a new stratum functionalis following monstruction or particition.
- Stratum functionalis (Suck'-draw-AL-is) The layer of the endometrium next to the utorine cavity that is shed during monetration and that forms the motornal portion of the placenta during gostation.
- Stretch receptor Receptor in the walls of blood versels, airways, or organs that monitors the amount of stretching. Also termed barranceptor.
- Steine (STRI-d) Internal scarring due to overstretching of the skin in which collagen fibers and blood vessels in the dermis are damaged. Also called stretch marks.
- Streena (STRO-out) The tissue that forms the ground substance, foundation, or framework of an organ, as opposed to its functional parts (puroscluma).
- Subarachnoid (nob'-s-RAK-noyd) space A space between the arachnoid mater and the pia mater that surrounds the brain and spinal cord and through which epiderospinal fluid circulates.
- Substanteens (sub'-kib-TA-nd-us) Beneath the skin. Also called hypotherenic (hit-ph-DER-unik).
- Subcutaments (subQ) layer A continuous sheet of accolar connection tissue and adipose tissue between the domain of the skin and the deep fascia of the muscles. Also called the hypothermis.
- Subdural (sub-DOO-rol) space A space between the does mater and the arachaesid mater of the brain and spinal cord that contains a small amount of fluid.
- Subdingual (suft-LING-great) gland One of a pair of saferary glands situated in the floor of the mouth deep to the response membrane and to the side of the largest fremslam, with a duct (Rivings') that opens into the floor of the mouth.
- Submandibular (sub'-mun-DBS-0-lar) gland One of a pair of salineary glands found inferior to the base of the tempor deep to the mecous membrane in the posterior part of the floor of the recents, posterior to the sublinguoi glands, with a dust (Whanton's) situated to the side of the langual frenshim. Also called the submaxillary rouls'-NAX, sides 0 glands.
- Submucosa (sub-mit-KÖ-sa) A layer of connective tissue located deep to a mucous membrane, as in the gustrointentinal tract or the urinary bladder, the submucosa connects the mucosa to the mucularia layer.

- Submucosal piecos A network of automotic nerve fibers located in the superficial part of the submicous layer of the small intention. Also called the piecos of Meissner (MIZ-ner).
- Substrate A molecule on which an entreme acts.
- Substhalames (sub-THAL-a-mes) Part of the diencephalon inferior to the thalames, the substantia signs and red nucleus extend from the midbrain ions the substhalames.
- Sudoriferous (2002'-dox-IF-or-un) gland An apocrine or ecceine exoccine gland in the dermin or subcutaneous layer that geodeses perspiration. Also called a swent stand.
- Subran (SUL-lean) A groove or depression between parts, especially between the consolutions of the brain. Plant is sub-OUL-413.
- Superficial (soo'-per-FRSH-al) Located on or mise the surface of the body or an organ. Also called external.
- Superficial subcutaneous inguinal (IN-gwi-nal) ring A triangular opening in the aponeurosis of the external oblique muscle that represents the termination of the inguinal canal.
- Superior (1000-PER-0-or) Toward the head or upper part of a structure. Also called rephalic or crantal.
- Superior vena cava (VE-su KA-va) (SVC) Large vein that collects blood from parts of the body superior to the heart and neturns it to the right attents.
- Supination (soo-pi-NA-shan) A movement of the forcarm in which the pulm is turned automorby.
- Surface anatomy The study of the structures that can be identified from the outside of the body.
- Surfactant (sur-FAX-tant) Complex mixture of phospholipids and lipoproteins, produced by type II absocker (septal) cells in the lungs, that decreases surface tension.
- Suspensory ligament (no-PEN-no-of LIG-a-mont) A field of peritoneous extending laterally from the surface of the owary to the polying wall.
- Sutural (SOO-class-all bone A small bone located within a sature between certain cranial bones. Also called Worman (WER and an) bones.
- Subare (SOO-class) An immovable fibrous joint that joins skall bones.
- Sympathetic (nim*-pu-THEF-ik) divisions One of the two subdivisions of the autonomic nervous system, having cell bodies of pregangionic nearons in the lateral gray columns of the thoracic segment and the first two or three lumbar segments of the spinal cord, primarily concented with processes involving the expendition of energy.
- Sympathetic trunk gaugilion (GANG-gil-on) A cluster of cell bodies of sympathetic postganglionic neurons lateral to the tectobed column, close to the body of a vertebra. These gaugilia extend infectively through the neck, thorax, and abdosien to the cocycs on both sides of the
 vertebral column and are connected to one
 another to form a chain on each side of the
 vertebral column. Also called sympathetic
 chain, vertebral chain gauglia, or paravertebrat gauglia.
