whose death dates are somewhat earlier and who were not included in earlier works Among the entries are a number of African Americans and nearly one half of the entries are women Some 80 contributors from the United States and Canada provided sketches many based on original source material This supplement follows the practice and format of the earlier volumes though it allows presidents of the American Library Association to compete for inclusion with other nominations
