Anderson, 2010-01-27 James Anderson critically reinterprets the history of southern black education from Reconstruction to the Great Depression By placing black schooling within a political cultural and economic context he offers fresh insights into black commitment to education the peculiar significance of Tuskegee Institute and the conflicting goals of various philanthropic groups among other matters Initially ex slaves attempted to create an educational system that would support and extend their emancipation but their children were pushed into a system of industrial education that presupposed black political and economic subordination This conception of education and social order supported by northern industrial philanthropists some black educators and most southern school officials conflicted with the aspirations of ex slaves and their descendants resulting at the turn of the century in a bitter national debate over the purposes of black education Because blacks lacked economic and political power white elites were able to control the structure and content of black elementary secondary normal and college education during the first third of the twentieth century Nonetheless blacks persisted in their struggle to develop an educational system in accordance with their own needs and desires

black community He became a bank president and urged Planet readers to comport themselves as gentlemen but a year after he ran for governor in 1921 Mitchell s fortunes suffered a drastic reversal His bank failed and he was convicted of fraud and sentenced to three years in the state penitentiary The conviction was overturned on technicalities but the so called reforms that allowed state regulation of black businesses had done their worst and Mitchell died in poverty and some disgrace Basing her portrait on thorough primary research conducted over several decades Ann Field Alexander brings Mitchell to life in all his complexity and contradiction a combative resilient figure of protest and accommodation who epitomizes the African American experience in the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries
