A polarization is apparent between the weak, which is manifested through the expression of belonging as we, and the strong individual. The subject position as strong, positive, and capable as a reaction towards the weak, the negative, is one of the few positions that are available to them. Furthermore, the book demonstrates the strategies of resistance the young women develop against the marginalisation, stereotyping, and othering they experience in their everyday lives. Finally, the author discusses the paradox of gender: Disabled bodies are often seen as non-gendered, however, these young women's experiences are structured by both the gender regimes within sports and the larger gender order of the society.
