Morphologies of Asia and Africa Alan S. Kaye, 2007-06-23 In 1997 Eisenbrauns published the highly regarded two volume Phonologies of Asia and Africa edited by Alan Kaye with the assistance of Peter T Daniels and the book rapidly became the standard reference for the phonologies of the Afro Asiatic languages. Now the concept has been extended and Kaye has assembled nearly 50 scholars to write essays on the morphologies of the same language group. The coverage is complete, copious and again will likely become the standard work in the field. Contributors are an international Who's Who of Afro Asiatic linguistics from Appleyard to Leslau to Voigt. It is with great sadness that we report the death of Alan Kaye on May 31 2007 while these volumes were in the final stages of preparation for the press. Alan was diagnosed with bone cancer on May 1 while on research leave in the United Arab Emirates and was brought home to Fullerton by his son on May 22.

Similative and Equative Constructions Yvonne Treis, Martine Vanhove, 2017-05-31 While comparative constructions have been extensively studied in the past decades the expression of equality and similarity has so far attracted little attention in the typological literature. The fifteen contributions assembled in this volume study similative and equative constructions in typologically and genetically distant languages albeit with a focus on Africa and from a range of perspectives. Purely synchronically oriented case studies are supplemented by contributions that also shed light on the diachronic development of similative and equative constructions in language contact situations. Sources of similative morphemes and lexically expressed concepts of likeness are examined and little known multifunctionality patterns and grammaticalisation targets of similative morphemes such as purpose clause markers, modality morphemes and markers of glottonyms are discussed. Based on a sample of 119 languages worldwide a new typology of equative constructions is proposed. The book should be of interest to typologists, semanticists, specialists of grammaticalization, historical linguistics and syntax.
