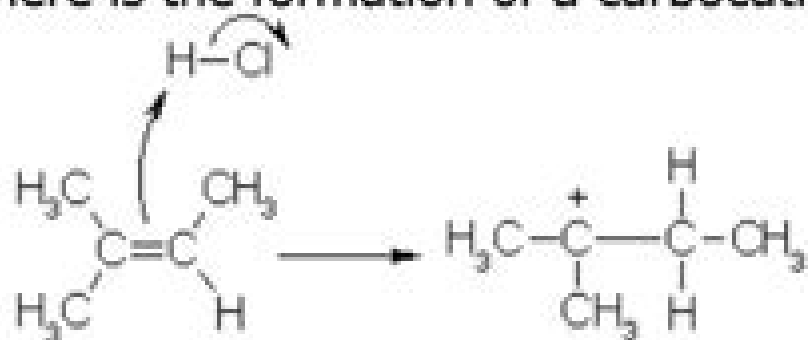
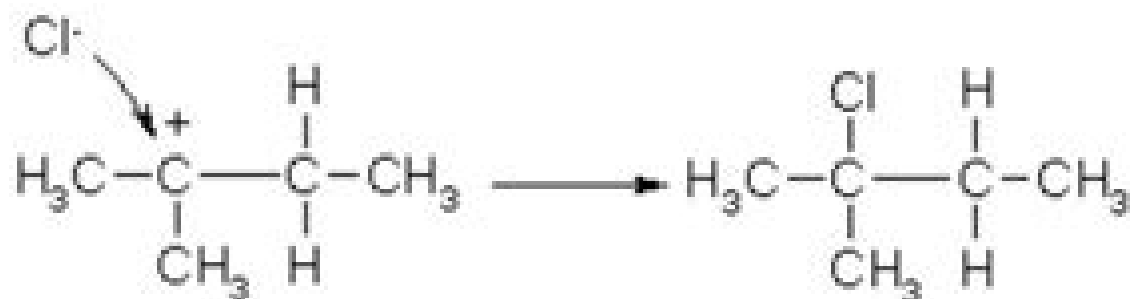


Electrophilic Addition II
