Enlightenment ideas ultimately gave rise to a defining force in modern conservative politics the common sense of the common man Whether twenty first century politicians who invoke the grievances of the people are conscious of this unusual lineage or not Lepist explains both the persistence of the trope and the complicity of some conservative thinkers with the Trump regime
