Chardon, 1997-01-01 Thirty years after Meriwether Lewis and William Clark passed through the Mandan villages in present day North Dakota the Upper Missouri River region was being plied by fur traders In 1834 Francis A Chardon a Philadelphian of French extraction took charge of Fort Clark a main post of the American Fur Company on the Upper
