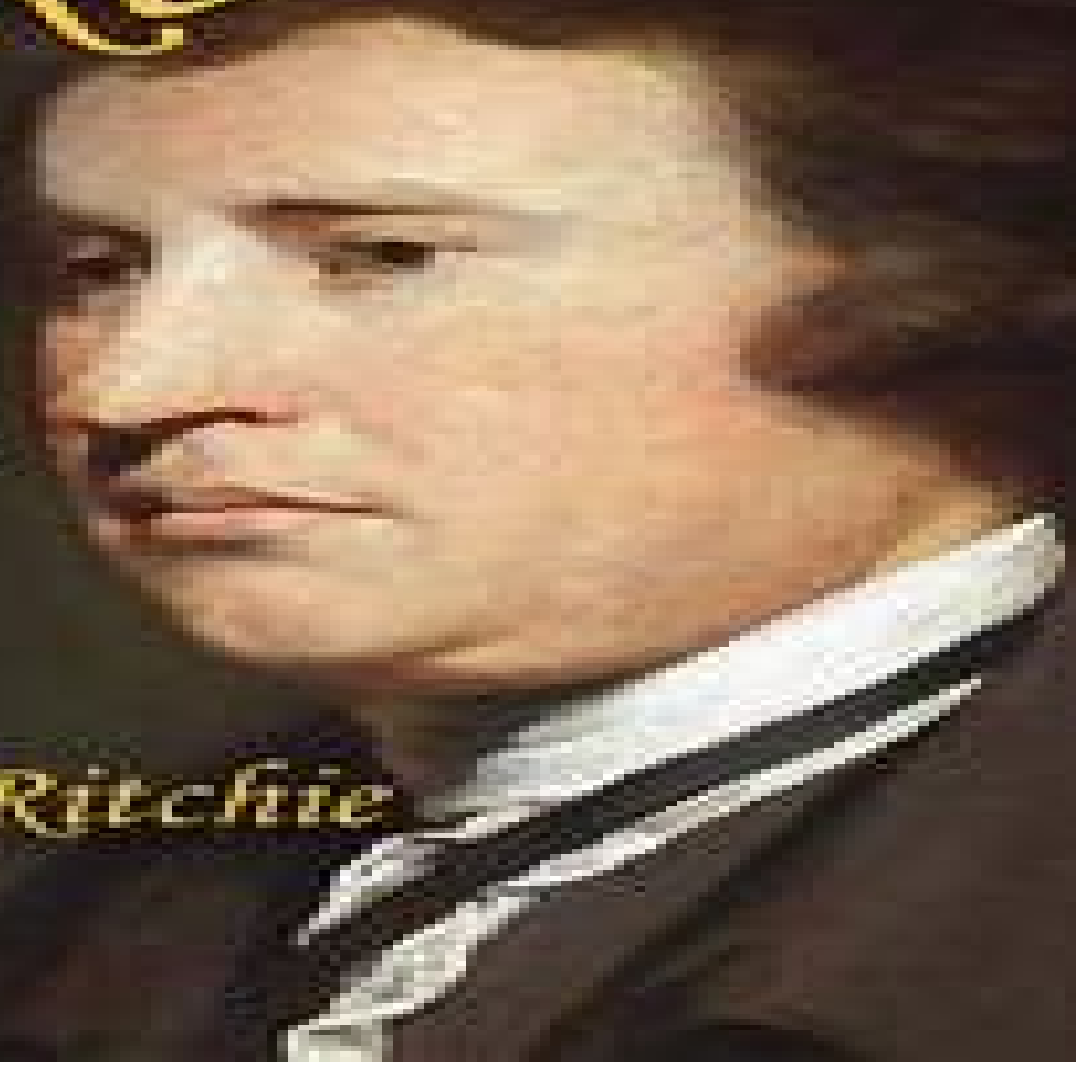

Edmund Burke Daniel E. Ritchie, 2017-09-08 The eighteenth century remains contemporary more than 200 years later because the fundamental questions raised then about politics in both the American and French Revolutions still speak to us The writings of Edmund Burke on these and other political events of his time are today acknowledged as the basis of modern conservative thought This volume brings together an outstanding collection of interpretative essays on Burke and serves as a basic introduction to this seminal thinker A member of the British Parliament from 1766 to 1794 Edmund Burke had sympathized with the American War of Independence and argued for reform of British policy toward Ireland and India but he surprised many of his friends by his early vehement opposition to the French Revolution This volume brings together assessments of these and other statements by Burke by contemporaries such as Samuel Taylor Coleridge and William Hazlitt along with essays by Irving Babbitt and Russell Kirk who established his significance for twentieth century conservatism This is a collection of the best previously published interpretive essays on Burke It will be of interest to all those interested in the philosophical roots of conservatism in the history of political thought in revolution and in modern political ideologies

normative pivot for judging how to make important changes in civil society. Indeed even in his writings on the contemporary revolutions of his time Stanlis reminds us that Burke interpreted revolutionary events in France and America through the prism of the bloodless Revolution of 1688.

Russell Kirk Bradley J. Birzer, 2015-11-09 Emerging from two decades of the Great Depression and the New Deal and facing the rise of radical ideologies abroad the American Right seemed beaten broken and adrift in the early 1950s. Although conservative luminaries such as T. S. Eliot, William F. Buckley Jr., Leo Strauss and Eric Voegelin all published important works at this time none of their writings would match the influence of Russell Kirk's 1953 masterpiece *The Conservative Mind*. This seminal book became the intellectual touchstone for a reinvigorated movement and began a sea change in Americans' attitudes toward traditionalism. In *Russell Kirk* Bradley J. Birzer investigates the life and work of the man known as the founder of postwar conservatism in America. Drawing on papers and diaries that have only recently become available to the public, Birzer presents a thorough exploration of Kirk's intellectual roots and development. The first to examine the theorist's prolific writings on literature and culture, this magisterial study illuminates Kirk's lasting influence on figures such as T. S. Eliot, William F. Buckley Jr. and Senator Barry Goldwater, who persuaded a reluctant Kirk to participate in his campaign for the presidency in 1964. While several books examine the evolution of postwar conservatism and libertarianism, surprisingly few works explore Kirk's life and thought in detail. This engaging biography not only offers a fresh and thorough assessment of one of America's most influential thinkers but also reasserts his humane vision in an increasingly inhumane time.

The Politics of the Center Vincent E. Starzinger, This is a study of what it means both strategically and intellectually to take the center position in politics. The two specific political centers considered are the efforts in France and England after the Napoleonic Wars to establish middle class rule as a permanent center or *juste milieu* between the extremes of revolution and reaction. The four prototypical political thinkers examined are Pierre Paul Royer Collard and Francois Pierre Guillaume Guizot in France and the English reform Whigs Henry Peter Brougham and Thomas Babington Macaulay. Starzinger carefully explains his choice of these critical figures, emphasizing in his new introduction a current climate of opinion that is far more appreciative of their contribution to modern constitutional government than the critics have been in the past. This is much more than an historical study. It is an effort to examine the enduring ideas and dynamics of political centrism which help explain why the center sometimes proves to be a hopeless position but in other circumstances can hold or even vanquish its foes to left and right. The work is highlighted by a comparative mode of analysis which explores these questions with sustained sensitivity to the differing social and political contexts of 19th century France and England. Starzinger also considers the moral dilemma of those who hold the middle ground. He asks whether such a center position must always lead to opportunism as its critics claim or may instead serve some high ethical purpose. Finally in examining the *juste milieu* concepts of sovereignty, representation, freedom and history, he addresses critically the classic question of what indeed the relationship is between political ideas and underlying social class. both political scientists and historians The Moral Foundations of Civil Society Wilhelm Roepke, 2017-07-28 Wilhelm Roepke may have been the soundest economist of the twentieth century He understood the limitations as well as the strengths of his discipline Economists are often tempted to take the easy way out by denying reality to aspects of human existence and reducing them to arbitrary and subjective tastes and preferences Roepke never does this and this is his strength He realizes that all of these are legitimate aspects of human experience which must be satisfied in a balanced and harmonious social existence Nature sex religion beauty and politics are all meaningful as parts of the whole Problems occur only when each segment attempts to become the whole The original title of this book *Civitas Humana* contains a double meaning It promises a treatment of questions fundamental not only to human society but also to humane society The volume combines distinct aspects of life Half of the book is devoted to questions of economic and social life The other half examines spiritual and national life Chapters include Moral Foundations The Place of Science in the City of Man Counterweights to the State Congestion and Proletarianisation of Society and Economic System and International New Order Although Roepke recognized the validity of the nation in the modern world he was constantly trying to find the smaller agencies within society in which real allegiances and loyalties were to be developed His ideas continue to be of significance As described by William F Campbell in the new introduction *The Moral Foundations of Civil Society* is a necessary addition to the libraries of economists sociologists theologians and philosophers *Congress and the American Tradition* James Burnham, 2017-11-30 Most Americans would probably be surprised to hear that in 1959 James Burnham a leading political thinker questioned whether Congress would survive and whether the Executive Branch of the American government would become a dictatorship In the last decade members of Congress have impeached a president rejected or refused to consider presidential nominees and appear in the media criticizing the chief executive Congress does not exactly appear to be at risk of expiring Regardless of how we perceive Congress today more than forty years after *Congress and the American Tradition* was written Burnham's questions arguments and political analysis still have much to tell us about freedom and political order Burnham originally intended *Congress and the American Tradition* as a response to liberal critics of Senator McCarthy's investigations of communist influence in the United States He developed it into a detailed analysis of the history and functioning of Congress its changing relationship with the Executive Branch and the danger of despotism even in a democratic society The book is organized into three distinct parts The American System of Government analyzes the concept of government ideology and tradition power and the place and function of Congress within the American government The Present Position of Congress explores its law making power Congressional commissions treaties investigatory power and proposals for Congressional reform The Future of Congress discusses democracy and liberty and ultimately asks Can Congress Survive Michael Henry's new introduction sheds much insight into Burnham's writings and worldview combining biography and penetrating scholarly analysis He makes it clear why this work is of continuing importance to political theoreticians

hand knowledge and her access to unpublished family memoirs has enabled her to paint a convincing picture of the basic personal security provided by Dawson's private life his friendships and his deep Christian faith a personal security all too often required as a bulwark against the vicissitudes and disappointments of his public life Dawson's Catholicism proved a problem to advancement in his academic career and when public recognition of his true stature finally came in the form of the Stillman Chair it came late in life and in a country other than his own Christina Scott shows that Dawson is best understood as he himself interpreted his historical subjects in the context of the spiritual world in which he lived the ideas that moved him and the faith that inspired his action Dawson was not a historian of ideas for their own sake he had a passionate belief in their liberating power *A Historian and His World* will be of interest to intellectual historians historians of religion and students of modern Catholic thought This is the first publication of the Dawson biography in the United States It is graced by a postscript written by Christopher Dawson reflecting upon the meaning of his work God of the Machine Isabel Paterson, 1993 *Moral Phenomena* Nicolai Hartmann, 2017-09-29 Since the nineteenth century moral philosophy in the Western world has been dominated by utilitarianism Kantianism and relativism Only a few philosophers have been able to escape from this Procrustean bed Foremost among these few is Nicolai Hartmann 1882-1950 Together with Henri Bergson and Martin Heidegger Hartmann was instrumental in restoring metaphysics Hartmann's metaphysics differs markedly from that of both Bergson and Heidegger in his indebtedness to Plato In 1926 Hartmann published a massive treatise *Ethik* which was translated into English by Stanton Coit and published as *Ethics* in 1932 *Ethics* is probably the most outstanding treatise on moral philosophy in the twentieth century The central concept of the book is value Drawing upon the pre-modern view of ethics Hartmann maintains that values are objectively given part and parcel of the order of being We cannot invent values we can merely discover them The first part of *Ethics* is concerned with the structure of ethical phenomena and criticizes utilitarianism Kantianism and relativism as misleading approaches After some introductory thoughts concerning the competence of practical philosophy Hartmann discusses the essence of moral values including their absoluteness and ideal being and the essence of the ought Hartmann is both controversial and compelling He provides a moral philosophy that rejects the subjectivism of the ruling approaches without taking recourse to older theological notions on the foundation of the ethical In sum Hartmann's *Ethics* constitutes an impressive and preeminent contribution to moral philosophy **The Jewish East Side: 1881-1924** Milton Hindus, 2018-04-24 This book originally published as *The Old East Side* is a collection of literature and documents ranging from the autobiography of the sculptor Jacob Epstein and the novels of Abraham Cahan to the reporting of William Dean Howells and the fictional reconstruction of a vanished world by Henry Roth The world is that of the old shtetl transplanted to a new growing country where the ghetto in the years 1881-1924 was an unstable mixture of nostalgic elements and the pressures of American economic and social reality The productivity both intellectual and material of the section of New York known as the East Side during those forty years around the turn of the twentieth century has

become a legend among many Jews in this country and deserves to become better known to many more of other ethnic origins The lower East Side was paradoxically a wilderness to be traversed and a portion of that promised land which had been glimpsed with so much hope from afar To wonderfully talented and observant children like Jacob Epstein the streets there in the 1880s were as filled with excitement as those of the Arabian Nights To serious philosophic young men like Morris Raphael Cohen they were as challenging as the marketplace of Athens had once been to Socrates to achieve intellectual enlightenment and the improvement of the social order The conditions of abominable crowding and poverty described in the sociological tracts of Jacob Riis Lillian Wald and others are better known perhaps to the average reader than the accounts of such pleasures as the dancing schools the Yiddish theaters the cafes the lectures the literary ferment and activities described in the pages of Abraham Cahan and Hutchins Hapgood But all the views presented in The Jewish East Side both dark and bright are recognizably parts of the same picture This book will be of value to sociologists historians researchers specializing in Judaic studies and students of literature

The Structure of Political Thought Charles N. R.
