Abel, 2013-03-09 My initial purpose in writing this book was to offer readers an update of my book Fetal Alcohol Syndrome and Fetal Alcohol Effects Plenum 1984 which con tained a broad overview of the history actually the absence of any history of the awareness of alcohol s teratogenic potential a review of alcohol s pharmacology especially with respect to pregnancy a survey of the physical and behavioral effects of prenatal alcohol exposure and an overview of the mechanisms sus pected of being responsible for those effects I have omitted most of the previously examined historical and pharmacological information because not much of what was previously discussed needed revision On the other hand because much more has been learned about the consequences of prenatal alcohol exposure and its potential mechanisms of action I have considerably expanded my discussion of these topics In doing so I have attempted to include as much new material as possible without I hope being overly pedantic and thereby losing the proverbial forest for the trees No book is ever entirely neutral in the topics it discusses the issues it raises or in its conclusions.
