William Gilmore Simms's Selected Reviews on Literature and Civilization William Gilmore Simms, 2014-02-07 During William Gilmore Simms's life 1806-1870 book reviews and critical essays became vital parts of American literary culture and intellectual discourse Simms was an assiduous reviewer and essayist proving by example the importance of those genres William Gilmore Simms's *Selected Reviews on Literature and Civilization* publishes for the first time in book form sixty-two examples of the writer's hundreds of newspaper and periodical reviews and book notes as well as four important critical essays Together the reviews and essays reveal the regional, national, and international dimensions of Simms's intellectual interests To frame the two distinct parts of *Selected Reviews* James Everett Kibler Jr and David Moltke Hansen have written a general introduction that considers the development of book reviewing and the authorship of essays in cultural and historical contexts In part one Kibler offers an introduction that examines Simms's reviewing habits and the aesthetic and critical values that informed the author's reviews Kibler then publishes selected texts of reviews and provides historical and cultural backgrounds for each selection Simms was an early proponent of the critical theories of Romantics such as William Wordsworth Samuel Taylor Coleridge and Edgar Allan Poe Widely read in European history and literature he reviewed works published in French, German, and classics in original Greek and Latin and in translation Simms also was an early ardent advocate of works of local color and of southern backwoods humorists of his day Simms published notices of seven of Herman Melville's novels the writings of Ralph Waldo Emerson and favorably reviewed Henry David Thoreau's *Walden; or, Life in the Woods* Simms published numerous review essays of twenty thousand or more words in literary journals and also republished two collections in book form These volumes treated such subjects as Americanism in literature and the American Revolution in South Carolina Yet as part two of *Selected Reviews* demonstrates Simms ranged much more widely in the intellectual milieu Such cultural and political topics as the 1848 revolution in France, the history of the literary essay, the roles of women in the American Revolution, and the activities of the southern convention in Nashville in 1850 captured Simms's attention Moltke Hansen's introduction to part two examines Simms's roles in and responses to the Romantic critical revolution and the other revolutions then roiling Europe and America

the lens of eight authors representatives of a South that seemed to them destined for greatness but was we know on the brink of destruction Exceptionally able and ambitious these men and women won repute among the educated middle classes in the Southwest South and the nation even amid sectional tensions Although they sometimes described liberty in the abstract more often these authors discussed its practical significance what it meant for people to make life s important choices freely and to be responsible for the results They publicly insisted that freedom caused progress but hidden doubts clouded this optimistic vision Ultimately their association with the oppression of slavery dimmed their hopes for human improvement and fear distorted their responses to the sectional crisis

In the "Stranger People's" Country Mary Noailles Murfree, Charles Egbert Craddock, 2005-01-01 In the Stranger People s Country tells the story of contact between a late nineteenth century Tennessee mountain community and an amateur archaeologist who wants to open the graves of the prehistoric leetle stranger people a source of myth to the mountaineers A politician looking for votes in the country has invited the archaeologist Shattuck to travel into the mountains with him but a mountain woman Adelaide Yates threatens to shoot anyone who attempts to violate the graves The courageous mountaineer Felix Guthrie joins the defense of the stranger people and competes with Shattuck for the attention of another mountain woman Letitia Pettingill Author Mary Noailles Murfree 1850 1922 uses dialect and vivid descriptions of mountain scenes to introduce the reader to Appalachia and its people She creates respectful representations of Appalachian life and explores some of the changes the arrival of outsiders brought to the mountains Murfree s depiction of social and aesthetic issues increases our understanding of the nineteenth century and serves as a literary precursor of the twentieth century Appalachian activist movements to preserve the environment against the strip mining and chemical industries This edition of Murfree s 1891 novel reprinted for the first time includes notes about Appalachian dialect and the novel s references to archaeology which have some basis in actual archaeological discoveries in Tennessee

Rivers III, 2014-11-18 Jacob F Rivers III has collected twenty two classic hunting tales by twelve southern writers including Davey Crockett Johnson J Hooper and Henry Clay Lewis These stories spring not only from a genteel literary tradition but also from the tradition of the tall tale or stories of backwoods humor Antebellum and post Civil War tales reflect changes in the social and economic composition of the hunting class in the South Some reveal themes of fear for the future of field sports and others demonstrate an early conservation ethic among hunters and landowners Early Southern Sports and Sportsmen brings to new readers a wealth of hunting and fishing lore heretofore hard to find by any but scholars in the field of southern literature Rivers has gathered a host of well read and well heeled sportsmen who relish each and every detail of their encounters with their environment Sports authors come from every spectrum of southern society but their common vocabulary and shared enthusiasm bond them together Rivers corrects unfortunate stereotypes of hunters as indifferent to aspects of nature other than environmental exploitation Whether humorists or serious advocates these authors reveal their sense of their place in the

wild and many advocate ecological good citizenship that disdains wanton slaughter and unethical practices They condemn such acts as beneath the dignity and honor of true sportsmen The collection includes accounts of hunting many types of game indigenous to the South from 1830 to 1910 from aristocratic foxhunts to yeoman deer drives The structure is largely chronological beginning with John James Audubon's essay on the American wild turkey from his *Ornithological Biography* 1832 and ending with stories from Alexander Hunter's *The Huntsman in the South* 1908 Whatever their era the chief characteristics of these sporting accounts are the excitement the authors experience upon suddenly encountering game the rigors and hardships they endure in its pursuit their keen powers of observation of the woods and waters through which they travel and the comedy often found in the strong friendships that frequently mark their adventures But above all the tales resonate with a reverence for field sports as the means through which humans establish meaningful and lasting relationships with the mysteries and the magic of nature
