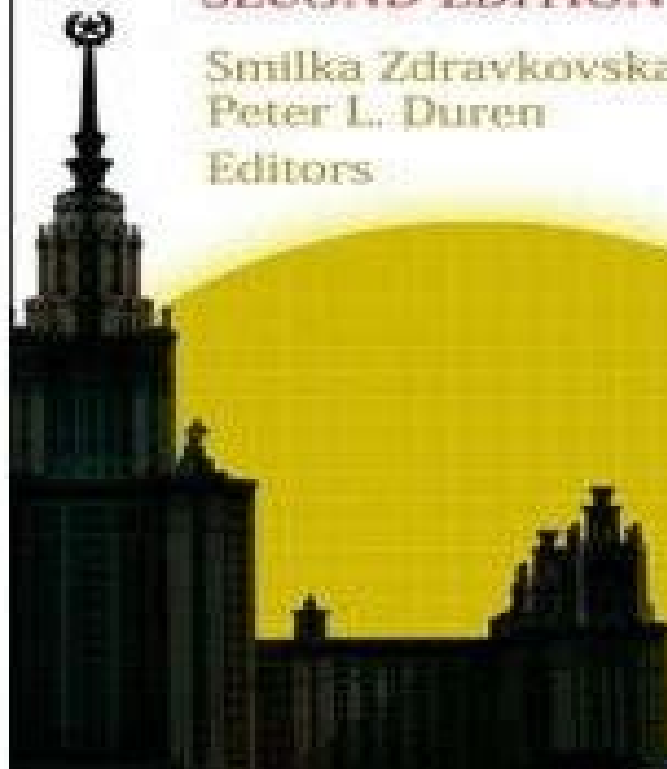

Duren, 2007 This volume contains articles on the history of Soviet mathematics many of which are personal accounts by mathematicians who witnessed and contributed to the turbulent and glorious years of Moscow mathematics The articles in the book focus on mathematical developments in that era the personal lives of Russian mathematicians and political events that shaped the course of scientific work in the Soviet Union Important contributions include an article about Luzin and his school based in part on documents that were released only after perestroika and two articles on Kolmogorov The volume concludes with annotated bibliographies in English and Russian for further reading The revised edition is appended by an article of Tikhomirov which provides an update and general overview of 20th century Moscow mathematics and it also includes an Index of Names This book should appeal to mathematicians historians and anyone else interested in Soviet mathematical history

Lectures on Number Theory Peter Gustav Lejeune Dirichlet, Richard Dedekind, 1999 Lectures on Number Theory is the first of its kind on the subject matter It covers most of the topics that are standard in a modern first course on number theory but also includes Dirichlet's famous results on class numbers and primes in arithmetic progressions

Weyl to representation and invariant theory for Lie groups and conclude with a chapter on E. Cartan's theory of symmetric spaces and Lie groups in the large The second part of the book starts with Chapter V describing the development of the theory of linear algebraic groups in the 19th century Many of the main contributions here are due to E. Cartan and above all to L. Maurer After being abandoned for nearly 50 years the theory was revived by Chevalley and Kolchin and then further developed by many others This is the focus of Chapter VI The book concludes with two chapters on various aspects of the works of Chevalley on Lie groups and algebraic groups and Kolchin on algebraic groups and the Galois theory of differential fields The author brings a unique perspective to this study As an important developer of some of the modern elements of both the differential geometric and the algebraic geometric sides of the theory he has a particularly deep appreciation of the underlying mathematics His lifelong involvement and his historical research in the subject give him a special appreciation of the story of its development
