Cutting edge research by twenty four international scholars on female power agency health and literacy in ancient Egypt There has been considerable scholarship in the last fifty years on the role of ancient Egyptian women in society With their ability to work outside the home inherit and dispense of property initiate divorce testify in court and serve in local government Egyptian women exercised more legal rights and economic independence than their counterparts throughout antiquity Yet their agency and autonomy are often downplayed undermined or outright ignored In *Women in Ancient Egypt* twenty four international scholars offer a corrective to this view by presenting the latest cutting edge research on women and gender in ancient Egypt Covering the entirety of Egyptian history from earliest times to Late Antiquity this volume commences with a thorough study of the earliest written evidence of Egyptian women both royal and non royal before moving on to chapters that deal with various aspects of Egyptian queens followed by studies on the legal status and economic roles of non royal women and finally on women s health and body adornment Within this sweeping chronological range each study is intensely focused on the evidence recovered from a particular site or a specific time period Rather than following a strictly chronological arrangement the thematic organization of chapters enables readers to discern diachronic patterns of continuity and change within each group of women

Tucker,1985 The book provides a unique account of the very active economic social and political roles of nineteenth century women The Englishwoman in Egypt: Letters from Cairo Sophia Lane Poole,1844 **The Role of Women in Ancient Egypt** Omar Khalil, Women in Ancient Egypt held a unique and significant position within the broader social and cultural framework of their civilization Unlike in many ancient societies Egyptian women enjoyed a considerable amount of rights and freedoms especially when compared to their contemporaries in other parts of the world The role of women in Egyptian society was largely defined by a combination of legal rights religious significance and familial responsibilities with many women being able to exercise substantial influence in both public and private spheres Socially women in Ancient Egypt were often portrayed as equals to men and their contributions to society were highly valued While men generally dominated the spheres of politics military and high ranking religious offices women were not excluded from positions of authority especially within the royal family and the religious hierarchy For example queens priestesses and high ranking women could wield political power and influence in matters of state and governance However their roles were primarily centered around the family and domestic life Marriage and motherhood were central to a woman s identity and women were expected to oversee the household and care for children In terms of legal rights women in Ancient Egypt were granted many protections and privileges They had the ability to own property enter into contracts and even initiate divorce if necessary This level of autonomy was relatively rare in the ancient world where women were often considered the property of their fathers or husbands Egyptian women also had the right to inherit property and they could pass on property to their children ensuring that their lineage could maintain wealth and status These legal rights enabled women to participate in economic transactions manage estates and even become wealthy landowners in some cases *A Wife Out of Egypt* Norma Lorimer,1915

Shereen Abouelnaga, 2016 The 25 January 2011 uprising and the unprecedented dissent and discord to which it gave rise shattered the notion of homogeneity that had characterized state representations of Egypt and Egyptians since 1952 It allowed for the eruption of identities along multiple lines including class ideology culture and religion long suppressed by state control Concomitantly a profusion of women s voices arose to further challenge the state managed feminism that had sought to define and carefully circumscribe women s social and civic roles in Egypt Women in Revolutionary Egypt takes the uprising as the point of departure for an exploration of how gender in post Mubarak Egypt came to be rethought reimagined and contested It examines key areas of tension between national and gender identities including gender empowerment through art and literature particularly graffiti and poetry the disciplining of the body and the politics of history and memory Shereen Abouelnaga argues that this new cartography of women s struggle has to be read in a context that takes into consideration the micropolitics of everyday life as well as the larger processes that work to separate the personal from the political She shows how a new generation of women is resisting both discursively and visually the notion of a fixed or authentic notion of Egyptian womanhood in spite of prevailing social structures and in face of all gendered politics of imagined nation

Doria Shafik Egyptian Feminist : A Woman apart Cynthia Nelson, 1996 Cynthia Nelson brings to life a bold and gifted Egyptian of the mid twentieth century who helped define what it means to be a modern Arab woman Doria Shafik 1908 1975 an Egyptian feminist poet publisher and political activist participated in one of her country s most explosive periods of social and political transformation During the 40s she burst onto the public stage in Egypt openly challenging every social cultural and legal barrier that she viewed as oppressive to the full equality of women As the founder of the Daughters of the Nile Union in 1948 she catalyzed a movement that fought for suffrage and set up programs to combat illiteracy provide economic opportunities for lower class urban women and raise the consciousness of middle class university students She also founded and edited two prominent women s journals wrote books in both French and Arabic lectured throughout the world married and raised two children For a decade she ignited the imagination of the press where she was variously described as the perfumed leader a danger to the Muslim nation a traitor to the revolution and the only man in Egypt Then in 1957 following her hunger strike in protest against the populist regime of Gamal Abdul Nasser she was placed under house arrest Within months her magazines folded her name was officially banned from the press and she entered a

long period of seclusion that ended with her suicide in 1975 With the cooperation of Shafik s daughters who made available her three impressionistic unpublished and sometimes contradictory memoirs Nelson has uncovered Shafik s story and brings the life and achievements of this remarkable woman to a Western audience Brilliantly re creates the untold story of Doria Shafik the most impressive exponent of liberal Egyptian feminism Magically the delicately sketched background gives the reader a wonderful sense of the sweep of modern Egyptian history The effect is mesmerizing Raymond W Baker Williams College A compelling story beautifully written Jacqueline S Ismail University of Calgary [The Women's Awakening in Egypt](#) Beth Baron,1997-01-01 Between 1892 and 1920 nearly thirty Arabic periodicals by for and about women were produced in Egypt for circulation throughout the Arab world This flourishing women s press provided a forum for debating such topics as the rights of woman marriage and divorce and veiling and seclusion and also offered a mechanism for disseminating new ideologies and domestic instruction In this book Beth Baron presents the first sustained study of this remarkable material exploring the connections between literary culture and social transformation Starting with profiles of the female intellectuals who pioneered the women s press in Egypt the first generation of Arab women to write and publish extensively Baron traces the women s literary output from production to consumption She draws on new approaches in cultural history to examine the making of periodicals and to reconstruct their audience and she suggests that it is impossible to assess the influence of the Arabic press without comprehending the circumstances under which it operated Turning to specific issues argued in the pages of the women s press Baron finds that women s views ranged across a wide spectrum The debates are set in historical context with elaborations on the conditions of women s education and work Together with other sources the journals show significant changes in the activities of urban middle and upper class Egyptian women in the decades before the 1919 revolution and underscore the sense that real improvement in women s lives the women s awakening was at hand Baron s discussion of this extraordinary trove of materials highlights the voices of the female intellectuals who championed this awakening and broadens our understanding of the social and cultural history of the period
