only after native born workers fled these suddenly undesirable jobs Ironically L A Story shows that immigrant workers who many union leaders feared were incapable of being organized because of language constraints and fear of deportation instead proved highly responsive to organizing efforts As Milkman demonstrates these mostly Latino workers came to their service jobs in the United States with a more group oriented mentality than the American workers they replaced Some also drew on experience in their native countries with labor and political struggles.
