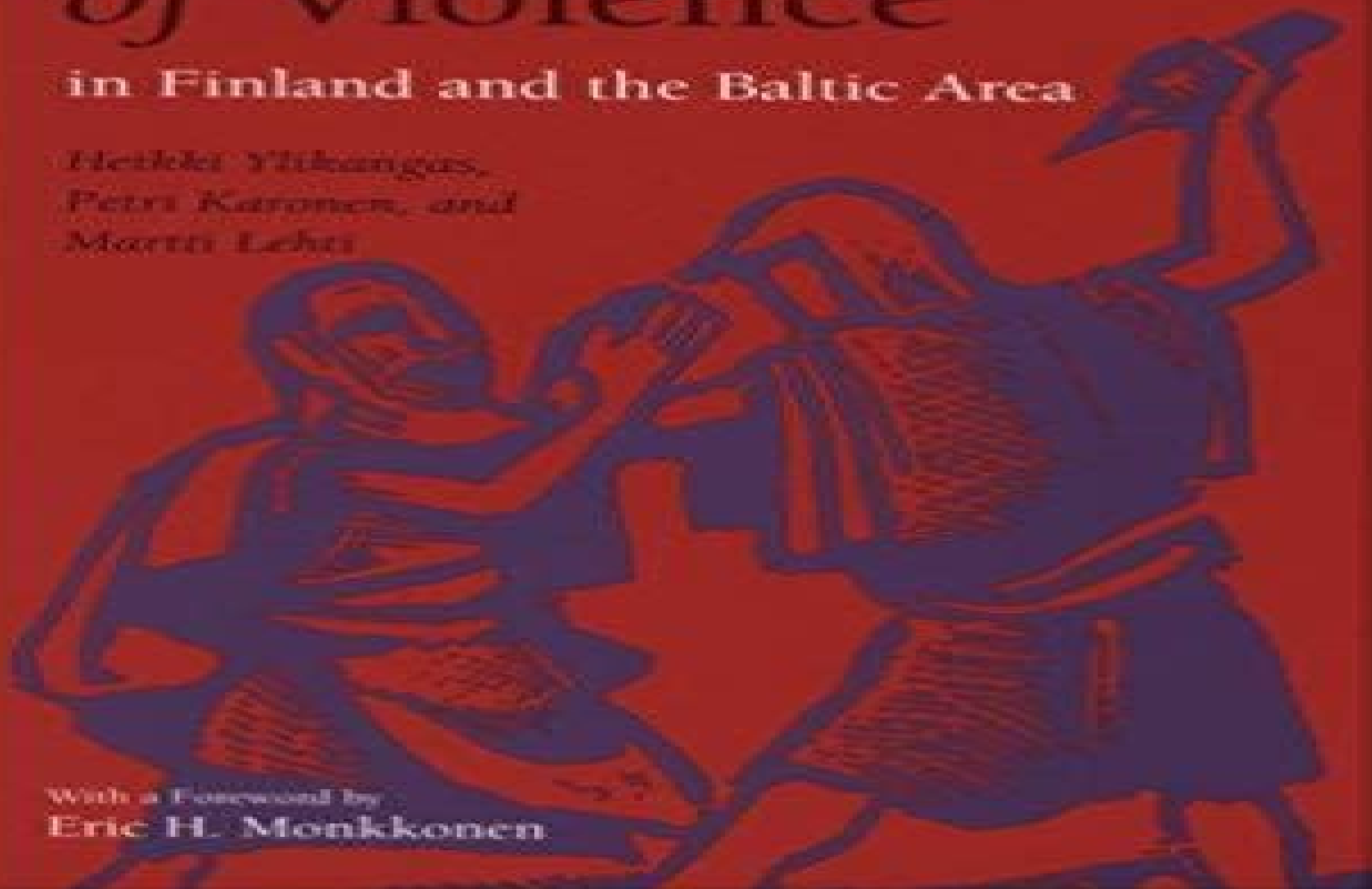

Five Centuries of Violence in Finland and the Baltic Area Heikki Ylikangas, Petri Karonen, Martti Lehti, 2001 Most people associate Nordic countries with peace tranquility civility high living standards and generally progressive social arrangements It is these very qualities that get Nordic countries rejected as policy models because they are too peaceful what happens there is too remote and too easy compared to the harsh outside world *Five Centuries of Violence in Finland and the Baltic Area* Mirkka Lappalainen, 1998 *Cops and Kids* David B.
