The four canonical Gospels present different perspectives, and address their writings to different audiences.

The Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke are so similar, they are called the Synoptic Gospels. "Synoptic" comes from the Greek word meaning "to see together."

John's Gospel is different. It was the last one written and only about 10% of the material in the Synoptics appears in John.
