IN SOCIOLOGICAL ANALYSIS

The analysis of social structures often occurs on three levels:

1. **Macro analysis** – looks at broad categories and systems like large populations and groups like entire countries or economic systems.
2. **Meso analysis** – studies communities or certain groups in a society.
3. **Micro analysis** – observes patterns and collects data from smaller groups like families, or individuals (DeCarlo, 2018).
