Economy Of The Unlost Reading Simonides Of Keos With Paul Celan:

Economy of the Unlost Anne Carson, 2009-04-11 The ancient Greek lyric poet Simonides of Keos was the first poet in the Western tradition to take money for poetic composition From this starting point Anne Carson launches an exploration poetic in its own right of the idea of poetic economy.
