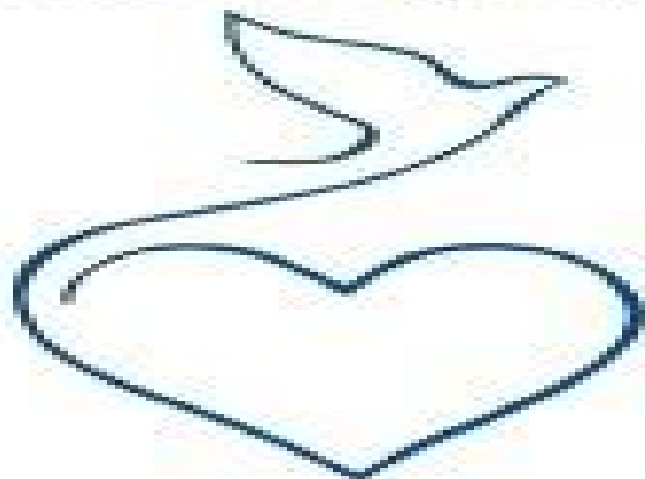

Implementation of an Evidence-based Palliative Care Program in Long-term Care Rachel L. Boyd,2015 Although palliative care has become a staple in the provision of quality care on the inpatient side palliative care remains underutilized in the long term care setting The lack of facility based palliative care programs in the long term care setting has contributed greatly to this problem The purpose of this clinical project was to improve palliative care utilization in the long term care setting through implementation of an evidence based palliative care program A program composed of nursing education prognostic screening and an advance care planning algorithm was developed and implemented at one long term care facility The Stetler model was used to guide project implementation Project outcomes focused on increasing palliative care nursing knowledge and on increasing palliative care screening compliance Program education resulted in an increase in mean knowledge score by 38% from pre to first post testing as well as an increase of 33% from pre to second post testing Palliative care screening compliance which included prognostic screening and algorithm use increased to an average of 43% These outcomes suggest that through facility based program implementation palliative care can be integrated into the long term care setting ensuring quality of life and cost containment The following chapters will discuss the development implementation and evaluation of this program as well as discuss implications for future practice Key words Palliative care long term care quality of life prognostic screening advance care planning nursing education palliative care screening goals of care evidence based practice Abstract
