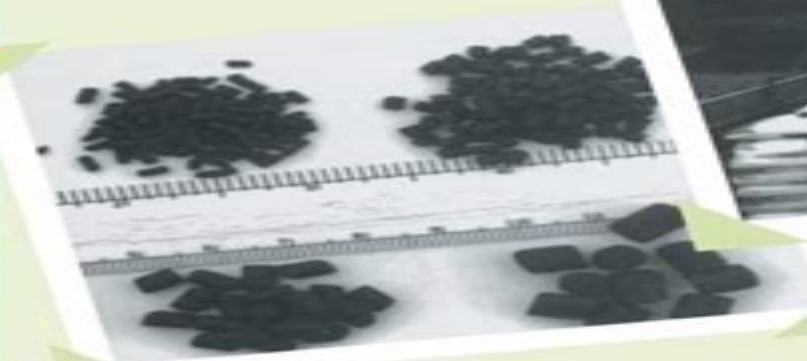

Feed Management in Intensive Aquaculture Stephen Goddard, 2012-12-06 This book has been written as a guide to the management and use of formulated feeds in intensive fish and shrimp culture While its focus is on the use of commercially produced feeds in intensive production systems it is anticipated that many of the practical issues covered will be of equal interest to those fish farmers who make their own feeds and to those who use formulated feeds in less intensive systems Feeds and feeding are the major variable operating costs in intensive aquaculture and the book is primarily intended to aid decision making by fish farm managers in areas of feeding policy The dramatic increases in aquaculture production seen over the past 15 years have been made possible in large part by gains in our understanding of the food and feeding requirements of key fish and shrimp species A global aquaculture feeds industry has developed and a wide range of specialist feeds is now sold The new options in feeds and feeding systems which are becoming available necessitate continual review by farmers of their feeding policies where choices must be made as to appropriate feed types and feeding methods While growth rates and feed conversion values are the prime factors of interest to farmers other important issues such as product quality and environmental impacts of farm effluents are also directly related to feed management practices **An overview on local alternative ingredients, aquafeed supply and feeding management in selected African countries** Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations, Garcia Sampaio, F. (ed.), Aquaculture plays a vital role in enhancing food security in Africa but faces challenges in the fed aquaculture sector particularly in accessing and producing high quality aquafeeds To address this FAO organized the Expert Workshop on Local Alternative Ingredients Aquafeed Supply and Feeding Management in Egypt in 2023 Experts and stakeholders from nine African countries Cameroon Egypt Ghana Kenya Malawi Nigeria Uganda the United Republic of Tanzania and Zambia participated alongside representatives from governments academia development agencies the private sector and farming communities Pre workshop questionnaires informed national reports on feed ingredient supply feed manufacturing and feeding management practices These reports along with workshop discussions form the basis of this technical document comprising nine country analyses and a regional synthesis Common challenges identified include limited access to alternative feed ingredients poor feed preparation and storage practices inadequate monitoring of on farm feeding lack of investment for small scale producers low technical capacity among farmers poor feed quality and weak regulatory frameworks The synthesis report recommends key actions stabilizing feed ingredient supply and costs promoting training for feed producers and farmers improving on farm feed and water quality management enhancing data collection and analysis expanding access to finance and storage facilities and strengthening collaboration among stakeholders These measures aim to build a more efficient sustainable and resilient aquaculture sector across the region **Sustainable Agriculture Management in Semi-Arid Climates** A. Report of the Expert Workshop on local alternative ingredients, aquafeed supply and feeding management, Abbassa, Egypt, 3-5 December 2023 Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations, 2024-06-18 This report summarizes the proceedings and outcomes of the Expert workshop on local alternative ingredients aquafeed supply and feeding management convened in Abbassa Egypt from 3 to 5 December 2023 The workshop brought together acknowledged aquafeed experts from African countries governmental agencies universities development organizations private industry and farmers The workshop was jointly organized by the FAO Fisheries and Aquaculture Division NFI and WorldFish Egypt and hosted by the WorldFish Centre in Abbassa Egypt The workshop objectives were to i exchange and share knowledge of the use of local alternative ingredients aquafeed supply and feeding management ii showcase technological advances and innovations in local alternative ingredients aquafeed supply and feeding management iii identify country specific challenges and issues in local alternative ingredients aquafeed supply and feeding management iv identify national and regional needs for technical assistance and capacity building on local alternative ingredients aquafeed supply and feeding management and v recommend strategies to address identified development priorities knowledge products on local alternative ingredients aquafeed supply and feeding management The workshop was divided into an overview country presentations technical and producer sessions The country presentation session included presentations from Cameroon Egypt Ghana Kenya Malawi Nigeria United Republic of Tanzania Uganda and Zambia The farmers experiences were presented by small farmers from Egypt Kenya Nigeria and Sierra Leone and experiences from Egyptian aquafeed industries Following a general plenary discussion the participants identified seven primary issues that currently constrain aquafeed production and feeding management in African aquaculture namely i limited access to information on alternative feed ingredients availability and accessibility ii poor feed preparation processing handling and storage at the farm level iii inadequate monitoring of on farm feeding and farm performances iv inadequate investment and operating capitals for small scale feed producers and farmers v inadequate knowledge and skills of farmers and extension workers in improved farm made feed production feeding management and farm performances vi poor feed quality and availability and vii lack of appropriate legal and policy frameworks required for sustainable aquaculture development including quality aquafeed manufacturing Recommendations

were proposed and classified under four categories i governance ii research and development iii capacity building and iv value chain
