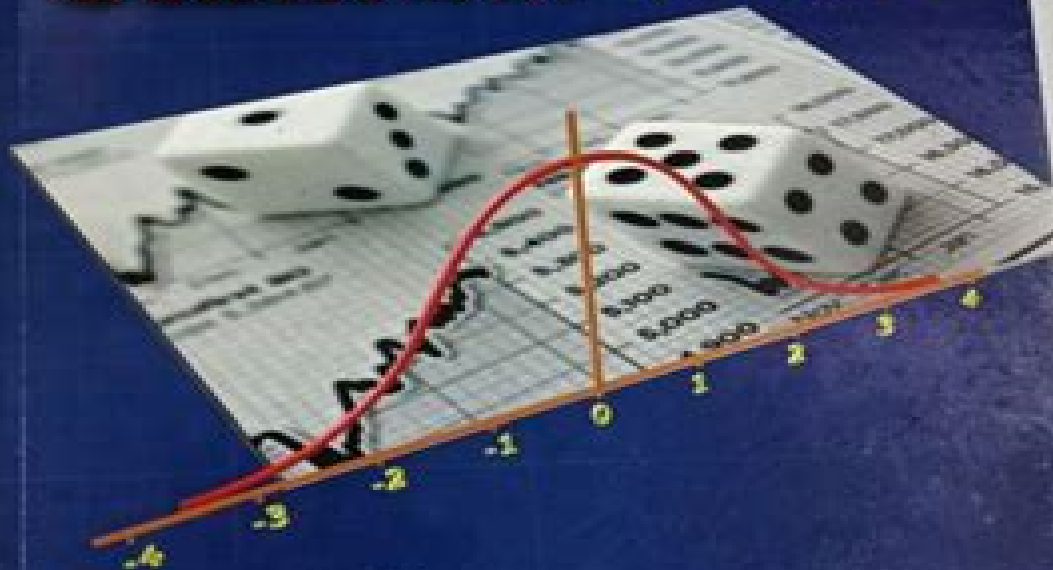


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Elements Of Stochastic Modelling (Third Edition) Konstantin Borovkov, 2024-02-08 This is a thoroughly revised and expanded third edition of a successful university textbook that provides a broad introduction to key areas of stochastic modelling The previous edition was developed from lecture notes for two one semester courses for third year science and actuarial students at the University of Melbourne This book reviews the basics of probability theory and presents topics on Markov chains Markov decision processes jump Markov processes elements of queueing theory basic renewal theory elements of time series and simulation It also features elements of stochastic calculus and introductory mathematical finance This makes the book suitable for a larger variety of university courses presenting the fundamentals of modern stochastic modelling To make the text covering a lot of material more appealing and accessible to the reader instead of rigorous proofs we often give only sketches of the arguments with indications as to why a particular result holds and also how it is related to other results and illustrate them by examples It is in this aspect that the present third edition differs from the second one the included background material and argument sketches have been extended made more graphical and informative The whole text was reviewed and streamlined wherever possible to make the book more attractive and useful for readers Where appropriate the book includes references to more specialised texts on respective topics that contain both complete proofs and more advanced material

Robinson, 2012-12-06 A group is defined by means of the laws of combinations of its symbols according to a celebrated dictum of Cayley And this is probably still as good a one line explanation as any The concept of a group is surely one of the central ideas of mathematics Certainly there are a few branches of that science in which groups are not employed implicitly or explicitly Nor is the use of groups confined to pure mathematics Quantum theory molecular and atomic structure and crystallography are just a few of the areas of science in which the idea of a group as a measure of symmetry has played an important part The theory of groups is the oldest branch of modern algebra Its origins are to be found in the work of Joseph Louis Lagrange 1736 1813 Paolo Ruffini 1765 1822 and Evariste Galois 1811 1832 on the theory of algebraic equations Their groups consisted of permutations of the variables or of the roots of polynomials and indeed for much of the nineteenth century all groups were finite permutation groups Nevertheless many of the fundamental ideas of group theory were introduced by these early workers and their successors Augustin Louis Cauchy 1789 1857 Ludwig Sylow 1832 1918 Camille Jordan 1838 1922 among others The concept of an abstract group is clearly recognizable in the work of Arthur Cayley 1821 1895 but it did not really win widespread acceptance until Walther von Dyck 1856 1934 introduced presentations of groups

Advanced Linear Algebra Steven Roman, 2013-03-09 This book is a thorough introduction to linear algebra for the graduate or advanced undergraduate student Prerequisites are limited to a knowledge of the basic properties of matrices and determinants However since we cover the basics of vector spaces and linear transformations rather rapidly a prior course in linear algebra even at the sophomore level along with a certain measure of mathematical maturity is highly desirable Chapter 0 contains a summary of certain topics in modern algebra that are required for the sequel This chapter should be skimmed quickly and then used primarily as a reference Chapters 1 3 contain a discussion of the basic properties of vector spaces and linear transformations Chapter 4 is devoted to a discussion of modules emphasizing a comparison between the properties of modules and those of vector spaces Chapter 5 provides more on modules The main goals of this chapter are to prove that any two bases of a free module have the same cardinality and to introduce noetherian modules However the instructor may simply skim over this chapter omitting all proofs Chapter 6 is devoted to the theory of modules over a principal ideal domain establishing the cyclic decomposition theorem for finitely generated modules This theorem is the key to the structure theorems for finite dimensional linear operators discussed in Chapters 7 and 8 Chapter 9 is devoted to real and complex inner product spaces
