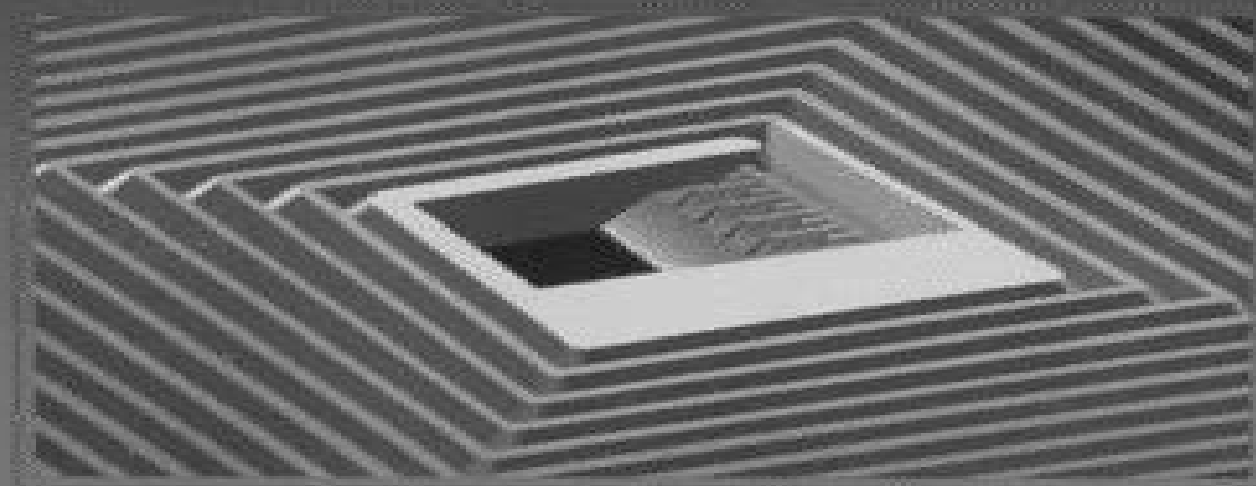

exemplary topics to concretely illustrate concepts and principles The book is rigorous in the sense of being technically sound but avoids both mathematical proofs and lengthy source code examples that typically make books inaccessible to general audiences Knowledge of elementary operating system and networking concepts is helpful but review sections summarize the essential background For graduate students inline exercises and supplemental references provided in per chapter endnotes provide a bridge to further topics and a springboard to the research literature for those in industry and government pointers are provided to helpful surveys and relevant standards e g documents from the Internet Engineering Task Force IETF and the U S National Institute of Standards and Technology
