Gordon, Outta Sight Funk and R B Riffs for Piano Keyboards by Andrew D Gordon is designed to help piano keyboard players improve their playing technique with a wide range of different Funk R B riffs and grooves While living in London during my early 20 s I had the opportunity of developing my Funk R B skills by playing or jamming with musicians of mainly African Jamaican descent 3 to 4 times a week We would jam for hours on end including doing gigs to the early hours of the morning From this experience it is my feeling that it is important to play and learn from other musicians however if one is unable to do so then incorporating this product into your practicing routine is

the next best thing By using this book your Funk R B keyboard playing will definitely improve What is Funk Music Funk is an Afro American musical style originated by James Brown and later Sly and the Family Stone emphasizing the rhythm and putting melody and harmony in the background Funk often consists of a complex groove where every instrument is playing a different rhythmic part fitting together like a jigsaw puzzle Entire songs are written without any or minimal chord changes where one or two riffs form the basis of the song as represented by the examples in this book One of the most distinctive features of funk music is the role of the bass line as a foundation with melodic bass lines at the centerpiece of a funk tune The left hand parts in this book capture both the rhythmic and melodic essence of funk bass while the right hand parts capture the percussive syncopated rhythms of funk music similar to what a guitarist may play Funk music uses the same type of extended chords as in jazz including minor chords with added sevenths ninths and elevenths or dominant seventh ninth eleventh and thirteenth chords Each of the 55 examples has been recorded three times 1 The left and right hand parts are played through twice with drums percussion guitars and keyboards at the regular tempo 2 Rhythm tracks at the regular tempo of guitar bass drums percussion to practice the keyboard parts along with 3 Slowed down track of the left right keyboard parts with the drums so that you can precisely hear what the keyboard parts are playing For musicians students who would like extended 2 minute Play A Long tracks for each of the 55 examples ADG Productions offer downloadable mp3 Country Riffs for Piano & Keyboards Andrew D. Gordon, 1900 Blues Piano Practice Session Volume 1 In All 12 Keys Catalog Number ADG232 Author Andrew D Gordon Publisher ADG Productions I have created various Blues riffs and has transposed them into all 12 keys along with backing tracks to practice with giving you the student a fun way of learning how to play in all keys We all learned how to play our scales in all 12 keys so I have taken that concept and applied it to learning to play the Blues so that you can try to become equally adept at playing in as many keys as possible I have heard from teachers who have used my 100 Ultimate Blues Riffs book who will only allow a student to move on to the next riff once they have mastered playing the riff they are working on in all 12 keys certainly a great but challenging musical exercise Each of the riffs are either 2 or 4 measures in length that are notated and recorded around the cycle of 4th s Also there is a notation page whereby the riff is being used in a 12 bar blues progression so that you can see how to apply the riff to a real world situation Each riff has been recorded 4 times 1 Piano with rhythm tracks recorded around the cycle of 4th s 2 Rhythm tracks recorded around the cycle of 4th s to practice with 3 Piano with rhythm tracks recorded in a 12 bar blues progression in a designated key 4 Rhythm tracks recorded in a 12 bar blues progression in the same key Reasons for practicing in all 12 keys Often a singer cannot reach certain notes in the key that you have learned the song in therefore you will probably be asked to change the key of the song which you can do with confidence knowing all 12 keys Having the knowledge of playing in all 12 keys it will then become easier to learn new songs whatever key they are in Blues often use the keys of C F G Bb Eb Guitar music often uses the keys of E A D by learning as many keys as possible will enable you to adapt to the musical situation you are playing in Taking riffs chord progressions etc through all 12 keys is a great ear training tool relying on your ears to play

in keys that you are not used to before the muscle memory sets in Practicing in all 12 keys is a great exercise for the brain it is obviously hard work but the more you do it the benefits will become apparent By practicing in all 12 keys you will start to see various musical patterns evolve that will help you speed up the process of learning music It is my hope that as you practice playing in the various keys you will eventually not need the music and be able to transpose in your head Ultimate Blues Riffs Volume 2 Andrew D. Gordon, It has been over 20 years since I released the first volume of 100 Ultimate Blues Riffs for Piano Keyboards in 1996 my most popular selling book One of the constants has been the continued popularity of my Blues music instructional books for not only piano keyboards but also Saxophone Flute and Guitar With developments in music software faster internet download speeds for downloading mp3 audio files over 5 hours of downloadable audio backing tracks for this book I felt it was time to author a 2nd volume that uses newer software for improved sound quality Also it is the 50th anniversary since I started to learn to play Blues piano in 1968 I remember the wonderful feeling I had when I started to learn from the first two Blues piano books I bought from a music shop along the Charing Cross Road in London I still have both books Just Blues a compilation of Blues Jazz and Boogie Woogie songs and How To Play Blues Piano by Junior Mance I have again created 100 Blues riffs with many of them having elements of Rock Funk Country Jazz Boogie Woogie Gospel and Latin styles The riffs are in the order that I composed them giving you the learner an element of surprise as to what the next riff is going to sound like Each of the 100 riffs have been recorded twice the 1st time the piano part with a rhythm backing track and the 2nd time a rhythm backing track to practice playing along with I have also created a separate play a long track that consists of 10 choruses of the 12 Bar Blues progression I would hope that you will use each riff to build your own Blues song through the 12 Bar Blues progression Stuff! Gordon, The Blues Scale by Andrew D Gordon is he feels one of his most important books because of the nature of the blues scale and how it is used to improvise in many styles of contemporary music The book consists of 20 grooves Pop 2 Grooves Rock 3 Grooves Blues 2 Grooves Jazz 1 Groove Funk 3 Grooves R B 1 Groove Latin 1 Groove Gospel 2 Grooves New Age 1 Groove Reggae 1 Groove Calypso 1 Groove Acid Jazz 1 Groove Country 1 Groove Both the Blues scale and relative minor Blues scale are explained in detail and how they are used either separately or together in the patterns for each style the relative minor Blues scale is generally not used in minor keys Each of the 20 grooves in this book contains over 150 patterns in total using notes solely from the blues scale Each of the 20 grooves utilizes a chord progression that is commonly used for that style of music The patterns generally start off fairly simply and become more complex as the groove progresses The audio files contain recordings of all the blues patterns that are notated in the book recorded along with a rhythm section of piano organ guitar bass and drums and on certain grooves percussion Also included are extended 2.3 minute play a long mp3 files of all 20 grooves enabling you to practice playing the blues patterns or creating your own for an extended period of time MIDI files are also available The image to the right shows both the C and A relative minor of C Blues scales Throughout the book there are patterns of these two scales both individually and together creating a huge library of improvisational melodic lines to choose from The above R B groove consists of 8 patterns the first 3 patterns use the G Blues scale the next 3 patterns use the relative minor of G which is the E Blues scale and the last two patterns consists of a combination of both the G and E Blues scale which is demonstrated throughout the book in the various styles The image below shows both the C and A relative minor of C Blues scales Throughout the book there are patterns of these two scales both individually and together creating a huge library of improvisational melodic lines to choose from
