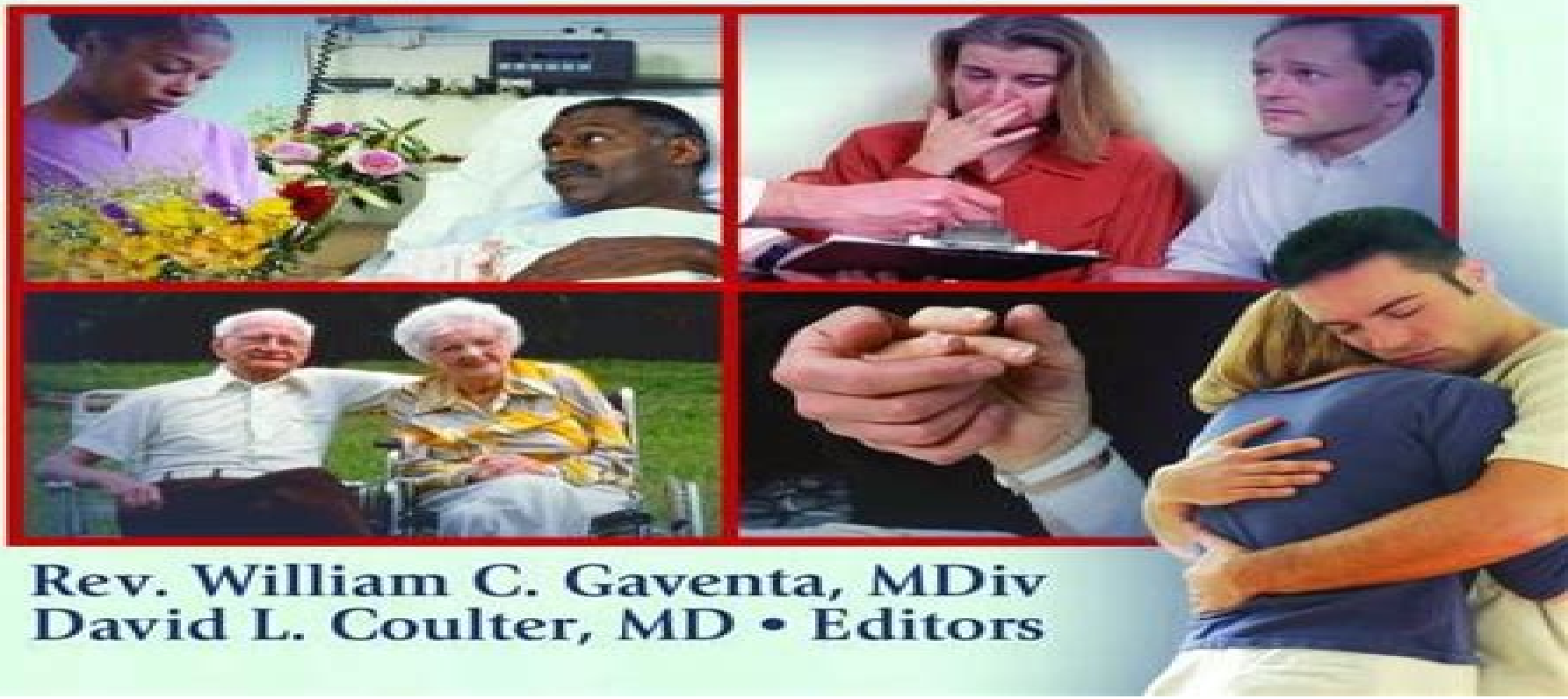

Topics reflect everyday community palliative care, hospice and disability services. The book proposes that the rights of people with disabilities should be supported up to and after their death. Going beyond problem identification, the chapters offer positive evidence supported responses that translate research to practice together with practice examples and resources grounded in lived experience. The book is applicable to readers from the disability field and mainstream health professionals who assist people with disability in emergency care, palliative care or end of life planning.
