**Hello Again** Michael John LaChiusa, 1994      **Ever After** Barry Singer, 2021-09-15 Written by Barry Singer one of contemporary musical theater's most authoritative chroniclers *Ever After* was originally published in 2003 as a history of the previous twenty-five years in musical theater on and off Broadway. This new edition extends the narrative taking readers from 2004 to the present. The book revisits every new musical that has opened since the last edition with Barry Singer once again as guide. Before *Ever After* appeared in 2003 no book had addressed the recent past in musical theater history an era Singer describes as *ever after* musical theater's many golden ages. Derived significantly from Singer's writings about musical theater for the New York Times, New York Magazine and The New Yorker *Ever After* captured that era in its entirety from the opening of *The Act* on Broadway in October 1977 to the opening of *Avenue Q* Off Broadway in March 2003. This new edition brings *Ever After* up to date from *Wicked* through *The Book of Mormon* to *Hamilton* and beyond.
