role of politics in education debating issues around power conflict and change and for the development of educational thinking such a chapter debating policy making and politics is vitally important The third chapter on philosophy of education is central to the study of the foundation disciplines of education as philosophical approaches influence and underpin education studies in terms of history policy research and practice The next chapter debates the economics of education and is particularly welcomed especially in an era that there is a decline in the study of this topic The next two chapters examine sociological and psychological aspects of education studies Finally the last chapter raises an interesting debate of the academic disciplinarity of comparative education drawing upon the challenges of organisational support funding and policy making Overall throughout the book the students are encouraged to avoid fragmentation and to develop an educational thinking beyond disciplinary perspectives without losing the relativity of education to these disciplines and their contribution to the development of the 21st educational thinking Ioanna Palaiologou The University of Hull
