El asunto no ha habido una atención que merece por varias razones. La evidente importancia de las divisiones de clase en la región hizo que esta categoría tomara preeminencia en las décadas de 1960 y 1970 cuando las ciencias sociales adquirieron mucha fuerza académica. Pero el nuevo peso académico de las perspectivas culturales sumado a la atención internacional que el tema ha recibido como en el caso de la Conferencia Mundial contra el Racismo celebrada en Durban en 2001 y la tradición de la influyente academia estadounidense le han dado un nuevo vuelo a la preocupación por comprender cómo el concepto raza ayuda a comprender el pasado y presente latinoamericanos.

### **Historia de la educación española**

El presente manual se presenta como base y guía para el estudio de los principales hitos de la Historia de la Educación en España. Una asignatura que consta de seis créditos se ubica en el segundo curso del grado de Pedagogía de la Universidad Nacional de Educación a Distancia UNED y se configura para mostrar y dar a conocer los principales hechos, contextos y referentes más significativos que explican el devenir de la educación en España desde la llamada Hispania romana hasta la actualidad. Un propósito que por la propia naturaleza didáctica de los manuales demanda un discurso conclusivo plantear ideas sintéticas e invitar en la medida de lo posible al estudio y análisis de otras fuentes que puedan completar lo aquí sugerido y planteado. En paralelo el manual exige un esquema conceptual marco que a modo de hilo conductor pedagógico y el análisis histórico para no derivar en puros análisis sociológicos culturales o generalistas que poco o nada tienen que ver con la educación. En este sentido y dentro del amplio marco de la estructura histórica de la educación se ha optado por un esquema conceptual guiado basado en el análisis de cinco unidades pedagógicas: los modelos educativos, las instituciones escolares, los contenidos curriculares, las innovaciones docentes y las personas que reflexionaron y abrieron brecha en el campo de la educación. Un planteamiento que da lugar a ocho unidades didácticas. Comienza con la educación en la Hispania romana, sigue con la aportación visigoda musulmana y cristiana de la Edad Media, continúa con los hitos humanistas y barrocos de la España Moderna y concluye con una contemporaneidad donde la Ilustración y la dialéctica pedagógica de los siglos XIX y XX y las leyes educativas más recientes de la democracia española sustancian el devenir de la pedagogía hispana. El primer tema elaborado por el profesor Rafael Sánchez Barea comienza planteando cómo la Hispania romana al trasladar a la península ibérica los valores culturales del Imperio insertó en su ethos el sentimiento propio de la civilización romana. La gramática, la retórica, la oratoria, el ideal tico, la jurisprudencia, la técnica, la filosofía y la ciencia fueron categorías culturales que se resumieron en el ideal de perfección del *vir bonus dicendi peritus*. Expresión que descansaba en tres exigencias marco: en primer lugar en el *bene sapere* o saber un pilar intelectual que se conquistaba a través de la filosofía y la moral; en segundo lugar el *bene dicere* o decir una exigencia filológica que se adquiría a través de la gramática y la retórica; y finalmente en el *bene vivere* o vivir era el elemento técnico-tcnico que se presentaba como meta y expresión de una vida humana ticamente valiosa y de una dedicación profesional técnicamente eficaz. Trilogía que de una u otra manera fue magistralmente representada por dos hispanorromanos insignes: Séneca y Quintiliano. La segunda unidad temática elaborada por el profesor Javier Vergara aborda la cultura pedag

gica de la Hispania medieval Mil años de historia resumidos en tres frentes sucesivos en primer lugar la Temprana Edad Media representada por las aportaciones de la pedagogía visigoda donde el símbolo de san Isidoro consiguió actualizar el saber clásico y trasmitirlo a la europeidad de su tiempo en segundo lugar la Alta Edad Media simbolizada en la pedagogía musulmana donde la inspiración divina del islam recogida en los libros sagrados de El Corán y la Sunna impregnó todos los resortes de la vida política social y cultural finalmente la pedagogía de la Baja Edad Media se nos muestra quintaesenciada en las aportaciones de los reinos cristianos Las migraciones intelectuales las escuelas de gramática el nacimiento de las universidades las escuelas gremiales y la reivindicación de la mujer como productora de cultura formal serán algunos de sus signos más representativos La pedagogía de la España Moderna que abarca la tercera y cuarta unidad didáctica ha sido elaborada por la profesora Beatriz Comella Gutiérrez Representantes del humanismo como Nebrija Palmireno Vives Ignacio de Loyola Juan Bonifacio José de Calasanz etc políticos del Barroco pedagógico como Diego Saavedra Fajardo y Baltasar Gracián y diversos enfoques sobre la educación de la mujer tanto en España como en América condensan una de las etapas más creativas y dinámicas de la historia de la Educación española Una etapa donde la síntesis virtud letras y doctrina se ve aderezada con un progresivo funcionalismo y secularización de la cultura que las centurias posteriores no conseguirán integrar Los hitos pedagógicos de los siglos xviii xix xx y primeros años del siglo xxi que ocupan las unidades didácticas restantes han sido resumidos por el profesor Olegario Negrón Fajardo El siglo xviii es el siglo de la Ilustración Una centuria donde los Feijoo Jovellanos Campomanes Olavide Cabarrús etc asientan las bases de un sistema nacional de educación basado en los principios de la secularización docente del economicismo político y de la utilidad pública bajo la dirección de un nuevo demiurgo pedagógico llamado Estado El siglo xix es un periodo de grandes y numerosas leyes educativas de excepciones notables y de creaciones pedagógicas reformistas la ley Moyano el catolicismo social pedagógico y la Institución Libre de Enseanza ILE serán algunos de sus hitos más representativos El siglo xx viene marcado por el pedagogismo de cuatro marcos sociopolíticos muy diferentes Alfonso XIII la II República el franquismo y la transición democrática Periodos convulsos y nada fáciles donde la legislación educativa se convierte en un puritano en una casus belli y en una obsesión de las administraciones públicas y partidos políticos Praxis que el bipartidismo político de los primeros años del siglo xxi reflejarán con crudeza La Ley Orgánica para la Mejora de la Calidad Educativa 2013 del Partido Popular junto con el Proyecto de Ley Orgánica de 2019 para la reforma de la Ley Orgánica de Educación del Partido Socialista son solo dos ejemplos de una cuestión recurrente y abierta difícil de resolver que sirven de colofón y cierre a la presente obra El manual contiene una serie de exigencias metodológicas emanadas de diferentes directrices del Instituto Universitario de Educación a Distancia IUED de la UNED Cada uno de los temas contiene un resumen y sus objetivos su contenido propio una bibliografía básica ejercicios de autoevaluación actividades complementarias para ampliar los contenidos y un glosario donde se condensan temas clave de cada unidad
