themselves how they think they should function how they expect others to function in relation to them early care must ensure that in addition to carefully selected and trained caregivers links with family home culture and home language are a central part of program policy If care becomes a substitute for rather than a support of family children may develop a less than positive sense of who they are and where they come from because of their child care experience This book presents the latest research in this vital field
