common they cannot want a number of admirers of as much docility as can be wished for in disciples To these the editor of the following little piece has addressed it there is no reason to conceal the design of it any longer The design was to show that without the exertion of any considerable forces the same engines which were employed for the destruction of religion might be employed with equal success for the subversion of government and that specious arguments might be used against those things which they who doubt of everything else will never permit to be questioned It is an observation which I think Isocrates makes in one of his orations against the sophists that it is far more easy to maintain a wrong cause and to support paradoxical opinions to the satisfaction of a common auditory than to establish a doubtful truth by solid and conclusive arguments When men find that something can be said in favor of what on the very proposal they have thought utterly indefensible they grow doubtful of their own reason they are thrown into a sort of pleasing surprise they run along with the speaker charmed and captivated to find such a plentiful harvest of reasoning where all seemed barren and unpromising This is the fairy land of philosophy And it very frequently happens that those pleasing impressions on the imagination subsist and produce their effect even after the understanding has been satisfied of their unsubstantial nature There is a sort of gloss upon ingenious falsehoods that dazzles the imagination but which neither belongs to nor becomes the sober aspect of truth I have met with a quotation in Lord Coke's Reports that pleased me very much though I do not know from whence he has taken it Interdum fucata falsitas says he in multis est probabilior at s pe rationibus vincit nudam veritatem In such cases the writer has a certain fire and alacrity inspired into him by a consciousness that let it fare how it will with the subject his ingenuity will be sure of applause and this alacrity becomes much greater if he acts upon the offensive by the impetuosity that always accompanies an attack and the unfortunate propensity which mankind have to the finding and exaggerating faults The editor is satisfied that a mind which has no restraint from a sense of its own weakness of its subordinate rank in the creation and of the extreme danger of letting the imagination loose upon some subjects may very plausibly attack everything the most excellent and venerable that it would not be difficult to criticise the creation itself and that if we were to examine the divine fabrics by our ideas of reason and fitness and to use the same method of attack by which some men have assaulted revealed religion we might with as good color and with the same success make the wisdom and power of God in his creation appear to many no better than foolishness There is an air of plausibility which accompanies vulgar reasonings and notions taken from the beaten circle of ordinary experience that is admirably suited to the narrow capacities of some and to the laziness of others But this advantage is in a great measure lost when a painful comprehensive survey of a very complicated matter and which requires a great variety of considerations is to be made when we must seek in a profound subject not only for arguments but for new materials of argument their measures and their method of arrangement when we must go out of the sphere of our ordinary ideas and when we can never walk surely but by being sensible of our blindness And this we must do or we do nothing whenever we examine the result of a reason which is not our own Even in matters
