direct and indirect However variations between humans is much less than in other species such as dogs and any two humans are at least 99.5% genetically similar Humans are also highly social creatures and tend to form either small or large social and cultural units that are known for their social and cultural bonding These may be either large or small and in the words of CH Cooley be primary or secondary groups that promote well feeling and outward feeling and help humans bond Cooley 1909
