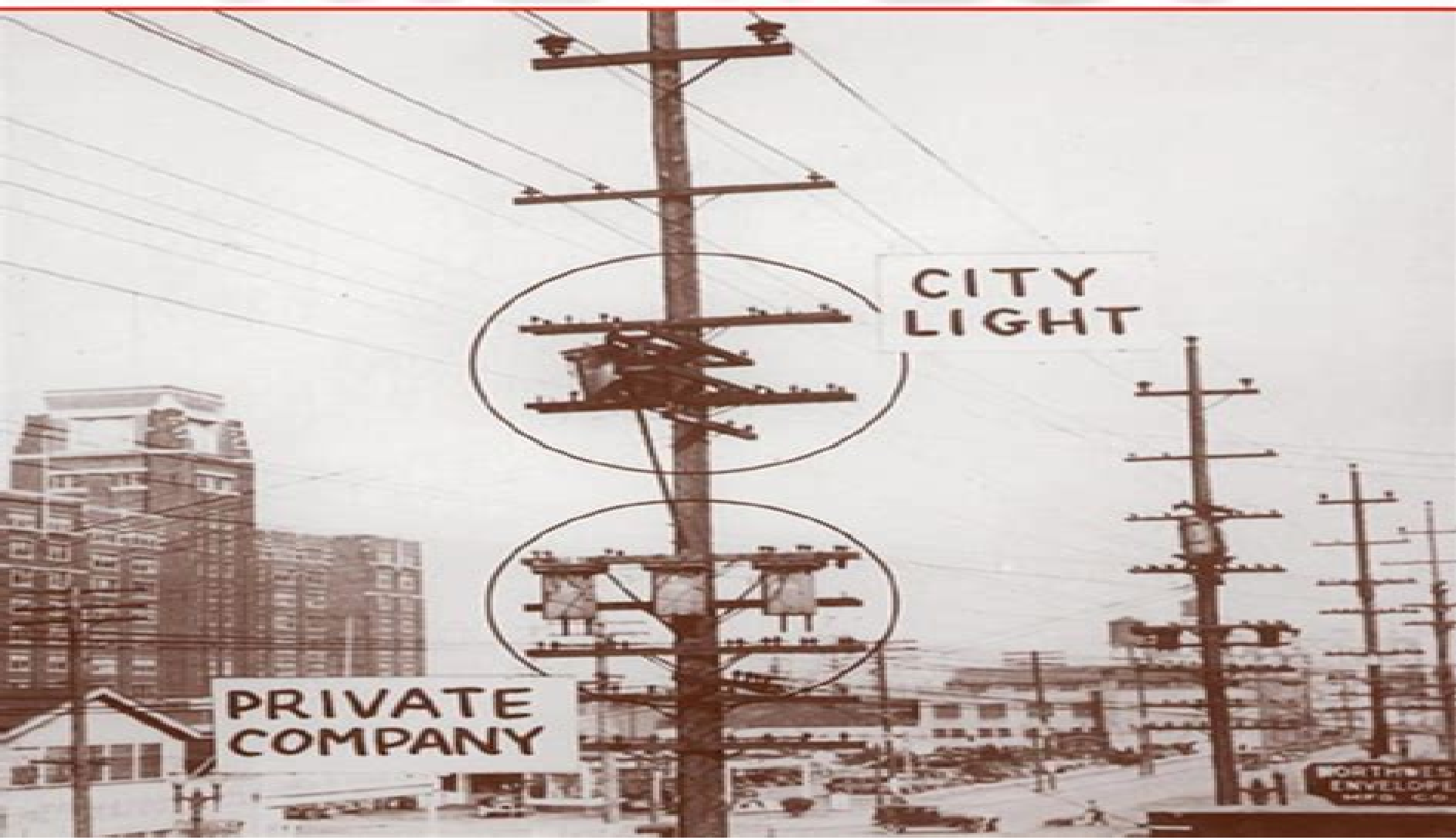

Krieger, 2011-03-08 Tomography is a method of exploring a phenomenon through a large number of examples or perspectives In medical tomography such as a CAT scan two dimensional slices or images of a three dimensional organ are used to envision the organ itself Urban tomography applies the
