Face to Face with Giftedness is a selection of papers, symposia, and workshops that were presented at the Fourth World Conference of Gifted and Talented Children held in Montreal in 1981. It is the first yearbook of The World Council for Gifted and Talented Children. It is divided into five parts: Social Contexts, The Meaning of Giftedness, Giftedness Deflected, Cultural Perspectives, and Curricular Considerations. This yearbook seeks to convey the conference theme—"Many views of gifted education for the advantage of all children." It does this well. But it also conveys other themes. Those interested in the field of gifted education will gain insight, inspiration, and, perhaps, impatience from the content presented. That is because of the three themes that recur throughout the volume: the paucity of "real" knowledge about the giftedness in the world community and the unrelenting need for such knowledge; the need for appropriate identification for those gifted students who are culturally different from the majority; and the importance of providing services for gifted children as early as possible and as well as possible.

The book includes requests for help and cooperation from all over the world as its first theme. Information from China, Russia, Nigeria, Israel, Germany and France will be of particular interest to those readers seeking a world view of gifted education. Such readers should not expect to find leadership and guidance from the information presented. Most of the authors are *asking* for such direction, academic foreign aid. Instead, these articles will give the reader a "we're all in this together" feeling that may serve to inspire cooperation. It may surprise readers to learn that one of the reasons for publishing this yearbook was to add to publications on giftedness available in French. The editors indicate that there are only two such books available. American readers, accustomed to professional libraries with shelves of such books, may find this hard to believe.

The second theme addressed by the book is one that troubles many students and practitioners in the field of gifted education. What can we do to provide fair identification procedures to children who are culturally different? Alanis Obomsawin and Karlene George
