emotional and behavioural development in the early years and make a vital contribution to reducing behavioural difficulties including internalised difficulties such as depression as well as externalised challenging behaviour Those working in the early years often want advice on managing challenging behaviour sometimes seeing such behaviour as being inexplicable rather than regarding all children s behaviour including challenging behaviour as a response to their circumstances When the behaviour is extreme it may be because the child s circumstances experiences are extreme and or the child s ability to make needs clear or interpret other people s intentions is impaired Both norms and extremes of behaviour can be understood using a framework that applies knowledge of how behaviour develops to consider a child s needs and what might be appropriate expectations of that child
