Außerdem finden sich darin Aufsätze und Studien veröffentlicht die aus einem Projekt der Forschungsstelle für österreichische Philosophie hervorgegangen sind welches einer eingehenderen Untersuchung der Geschichte der Philosophie an der Grazer Universität mit besonderer Berücksichtigung der Jesuiten und Lyzeumszeit gewidmet war zur Vervollständigung des Gesamtbildes werden schließlich noch weitere eigens für diesen Sammelband verfasste Arbeiten der Grazer Philosophen präsentiert. Der frühen historischen Phase sind die ersten drei Beiträge des Bandes gewidmet wobei in der aufwühlenden Studie Zur frühen Philosophielehre an der Grazer Jesuitenuniversität erstmals der Versuch unternommen wird die Inhalte des philosophischen Unterrichts wie er am Anfang des 17. Jahrhunderts im Rahmen der *ratio studiorum* angeboten wurde am Beispiel eines vollständigen Kurses darzustellen. Die folgenden Aufsätze behandeln jeweils einzelne an der Grazer Universität wirkende Lehrer oder befassen sich mit Problemen die mit Ideen und Lehrmeinungen im Zusammenhang stehen die von Grazer Philosophen vertreten bzw. angeregt wurden. In einigen Beiträgen werden zudem bergriffende Traditionslinien herausgearbeitet die sich aus der von Alexius Meinong begründeten sog. Grazer Schule wie auch aus anderen Impulsen besonders den von Alois Riehl und Hugo Spitzer ausgehenden entwickeln. Die Reihe der hier vorgestellten Philosophen wird schließlich bis in die Gegenwart fortgeführt. So zeigen die Beiträge in denen das philosophische Werk zweier prominenter Denker nämlich Roderick M Chisholm und Stephan Körners gewürdigt wird sowie die Selbstdarstellungen der Grazer Emeriti Ernst Topitsch und Rudolf Haller das breite und vielfältige Spektrum philosophischen Lehrens und Forschens an der Grazer Universität. Der Band wird mit einer bis zum Jahre 2000 reichenden Gesamtübersicht der Grazer Philosophen abgeschlossen.

Richardson,Sven Schlotter,2019-06-25 Rudolf Carnap 1891 1970 is generally acknowledged to have been one of the central figures of twentieth century philosophy He was the leading philosopher of the Vienna Circle a group that was central to the international movement known as logical empiricism which pursued the goal of making philosophy scientific and eliminating metaphysics that went beyond the limits of what humans can coherently comprehend Carnap was not only well versed in this area of thought but also contrary ideas he interacted philosophically with Gottlob Frege Bertrand Russell Ludwig Wittgenstein Edmund Husserl and Martin Heidegger and in his formative years he was influenced by the positivists Mach and Ostwald neo Kantians such as Cassirer and Natorp and Husserl s phenomenology Interest in logical empiricism waned in the decades following Carnap s death but was revived towards the end of the twentieth century the wave of new scholarship that resulted identified Carnap as far more subtle and interesting than was previously understood The complete fourteen volume edition of Carnap s published writings builds upon these more recent interpretations of his philosophy This first book contains Carnap s early publications up until 1928 none of which have previously been translated from their original German The introduction and notes place the text in the relevant scientific and historical contexts in addition to explaining obscure references or outdated notation and terminology Carnap s neo Kantian origins are more obvious in these works than in his later writings and the overall figure which emerges from this volume is a very different Carnap to the caricature that many philosophers will know

extended third edition provides a comprehensive and accessible introduction to modern axiomatic set theory After an overview of basic notions in combinatorics and first order logic and discussing in great detail the axioms of set theory the author outlines in the second part the main topics of classical set theory including Ramsey theory and the axiom of choice As

an application of the axiom of choice a complete proof of Robinson's construction for doubling a ball by dividing it into only five parts is given. For the new edition the chapter on permutation models has been extended and recent results in set theory without the axiom of choice and about cardinal characteristics have been added. The third part explains the sophisticated technique of forcing from scratch now including more details about iterated forcing. The technique is then used to show that certain statements are neither provable nor disprovable from the axioms of set theory. In particular it is shown that both Martin's Axiom and Suslin's Hypothesis are independent of the axioms of set theory. The final part with a new chapter on Laver forcing is mainly concerned with consistency results obtained by iterations of forcing notions such as Cohen forcing, Sacks forcing and Mathias forcing. The part begins with an extended chapter on countable support iterations of proper forcing notions now also including proofs of some preservation theorems such as preservation of properness and of certain ultrafilters. In the following chapters various consistency results concerning possible relations between cardinal characteristics and the existence of Ramsey ultrafilters are presented. For example a detailed proof of Shelah's astonishing construction of a model with finitely many Ramsey ultrafilters is given. Written for graduate students in axiomatic set theory Combinatorial Set Theory will appeal to all researchers interested in the foundations of mathematics. With extensive reference lists historical remarks and related results at the end of the chapters this book is also suitable for self study.

**Monatshefte für Mathematik und Physik**, 1928    **The Infinite in Mathematics** Felix Kaufmann, 2012-12-06

The main item in the present volume was published in 1930 under the title Das Unendliche in der Mathematik und seine Ausschaltung. It was at that time the fullest systematic account from the standpoint of Husserl's phenomenology of what is known as finitism also as intuitionism and constructivism in mathematics. Since then important changes have been required in philosophies of mathematics in part because of Kurt Gödel's epoch making paper of 1931 which established the essential incompleteness of arithmetic. In the light of that finding a number of the claims made in the book and in the accompanying articles are demonstrably mistaken. Nevertheless as a whole it retains much of its original interest and value. It presents the issues in the foundations of mathematics that were under debate when it was written and in some cases still are and it offers one alternative to the currently dominant set theoretical definitions of the cardinal numbers and other arithmetical concepts. While still a student at the University of Vienna Felix Kaufmann was greatly impressed by the early philosophical writings especially by the Logische Untersuchungen of Edmund Husserl. He was never an uncritical disciple of Husserl and he integrated into his mature philosophy ideas from a wide assortment of intellectual sources. But he thought of himself as a phenomenologist and made frequent use in all his major publications of many of Husserl's logical and epistemological theses.
