

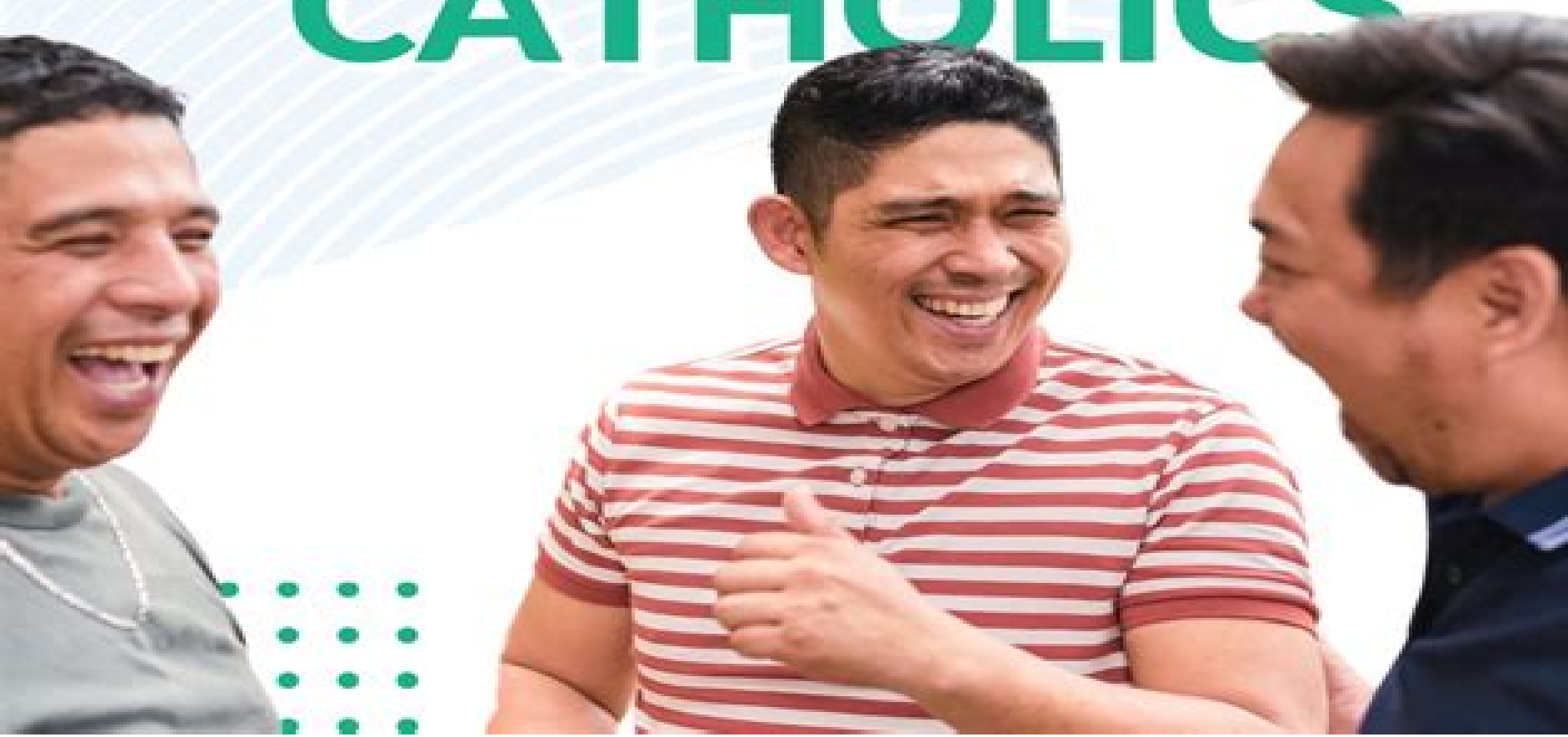

The Lion and the Lamb William M. Shea, 2004-03-04 One of the most intriguing questions in contemporary American Christianity is whether the recent warming of relations between Catholics and conservative evangelicals promises a thaw in the ice age that has lasted since the sixteenth century American evangelical Protestants and Roman Catholics have hated and suspected one another since colonial times In the twentieth century however each community has experienced radical change and this has led to a change in the relationship between the two In this book William Shea examines the history of this troubled relationship and the signs of potential reconciliation His springboard is the recent publicity given to the 1993 document *Evangelicals and Catholics Together* in which several well known figures from each camp acting as individuals signed a statement affirming much more common theological and social ground than any other American Catholic evangelical group had ever done Looking back Shea surveys the long and very bitter history of published recriminations that have flown back and forth between Catholics and many kinds of Protestants since the 16th century He makes the case that Catholics and conservative Protestants reacted along parallel lines to western modernity especially naturalistic evolution and higher criticism of the Bible That deeper history leads him to the more recent history that has partially overcome the severe Catholic evangelical antagonisms Here he focuses on the rise of neo evangelicals associated with Billy Graham and the National Association of Evangelicals and on the changes with the Catholic church since Vatican II He goes on to offer systematic interpretations of recent evangelical literature on Catholics and Catholic literature on evangelicals The book ends with some historical but also theological social and personal conclusions This accessible groundbreaking and timely study will be indispensable reading for all interested in the religious landscape of America today

House,2012-08-16 Whether and in what sense the Son of God might eternally submit to his Father s will is a question that has ignited a firestorm of controversy in today s evangelical academy On one side stand those who regard the affirmation of any inequality whatsoever in the Godhead as a revival of ancient subordinationism On the other stand persons who consider the Son functionally subordinate to the Father even within the immanent Trinity without respect to the Incarnation and regard their belief as integral to historic orthodoxy Many evangelicals moreover view the issue of subordination within the Trinity as pivotal to contemporary disputes about the role of women in church home and state If the relations of the divine persons constitute a paradigm for human life persons on all sides of the gender question argue human relations ought to reflect either the divine persons exceptionless equality or their orderly differentiation of roles At the same time others consider the issues of equality in the Trinity and gender relations irrelevant to each other and accuse both complementarians and evangelical feminists of degrading the doctrine of the Trinity into a partisan weapon The New Evangelical Subordinationism gathers commentary on evangelical debates about equality and subordination in the Trinity from representatives of the gamut of perspectives just mentioned Here evangelical theologians biblical scholars and church historians of widely differing theological orientations address themselves to the panoply of questions raised by these debates This volume unprecedented in the breadth and depth of its coverage of the controversy over subordination in the Trinity should become a standard source for teaching and research on its subject
