

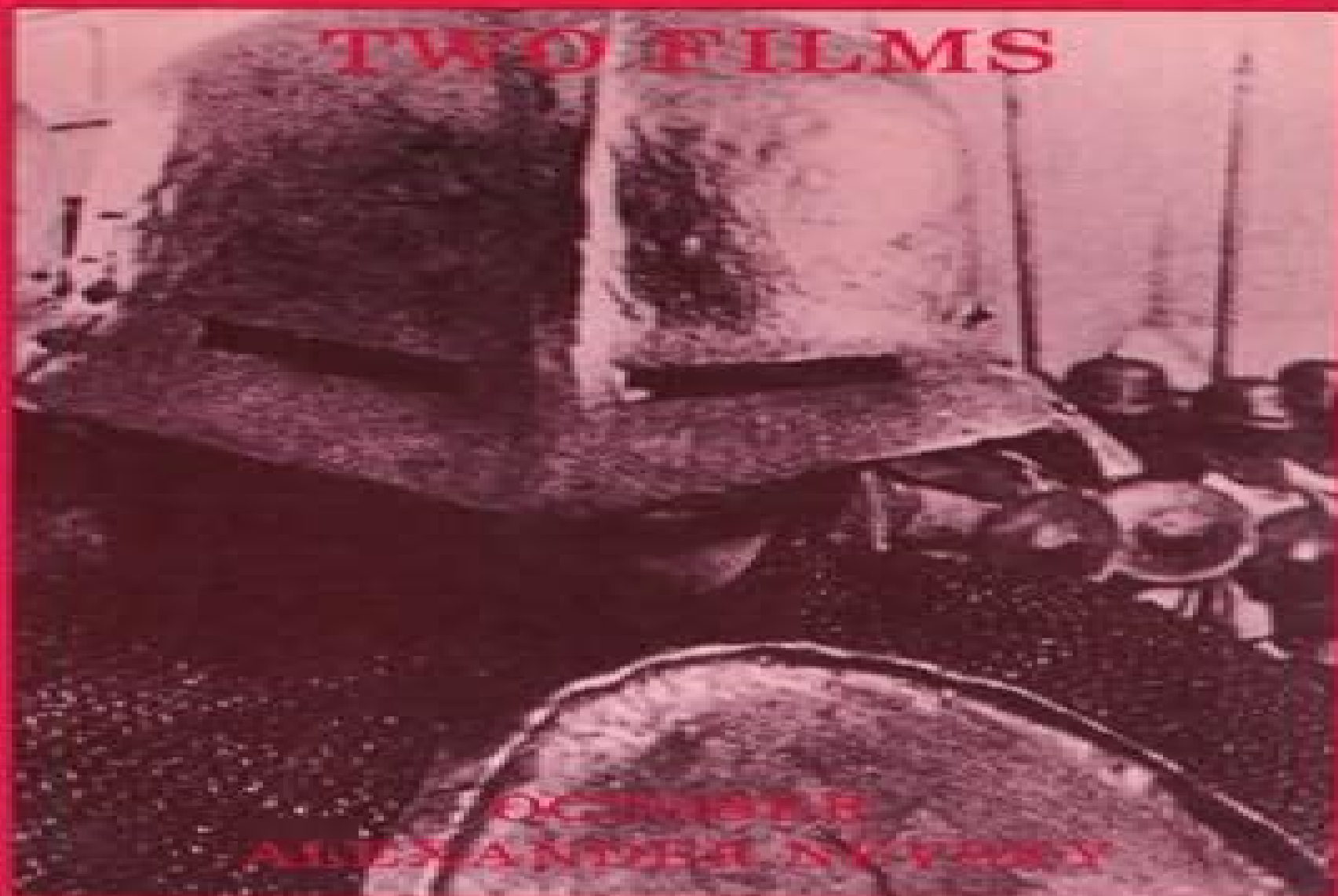

 annihilation they often turn to history for stories that promise a positive outcome to their suffering During World War II the
 French took comfort in the story of Joan of Arc and her heroic efforts to rid France of foreign occupation To bring the Joan
 narrative more into line with current circumstances popular retellings modified the original story so that what people
 believed took place in the past was often quite different from what actually occurred Paul A. Cohen believes this interplay
 between story and history is a worldwide phenomenon found in countries of radically different cultural religious and social
 character He focuses on Serbia Israel the Soviet Union China Great Britain and France all of which experienced severe crises
 in the twentieth century and in response appropriated age-old historical narratives that resonated with what was happening
 in the present to serve a unifying restorative purpose A central theme in the book is the distinction between popular memory
