The Origins of the American Detective Story LeRoy Lad Panek,2015-01-24 Edgar Allan Poe essentially invented the detective story in 1841 with Murders in the Rue Morgue In the years that followed however detective fiction in America saw no significant progress as a literary genre Much to the dismay of moral crusaders like Anthony Comstock dime novels and other sensationalist publications satisfied the public s hunger for a yarn Things changed as the century waned and eventually the detective was reborn as a figure of American literature In part these changes were due to a combination of social conditions including the rise and decline of the police as an institution the parallel development of private detectives the birth of the crusading newspaper reporter and the beginnings of forensic science Influential too was the new role model offered by a wildly popular British import named Sherlock Holmes Focusing on the late 19th century and early 20th this volume covers the formative years of American detective fiction

Sir Arthur Conan Doyle at the Cinema Scott Allen Nollen, 2004-12-10 In February 1903 a 30 second film titled Sherlock Holmes Baffled was released by American Mutoscope and Biograph Company the first known adaptation of the work of Sir Arthur Conan Doyle Over the years hundreds of adaptations and parodies of Conan Doyle's works have been released Though he is most closely associated with Sherlock Holmes other Conan Doyle works have found their way to the silver screen including the science fiction classic The Lost World 1925 The major adaptations of all of Conan Doyle's literary works are fully covered here plus a 1927 one reel documentary in which the author talks about his work and his psychic beliefs The focus is on how faithful the adaptations are to the author's work and the overall effectiveness of each film
