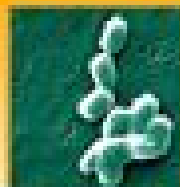

FOODBORNE ILLNESSES



Salmonellosis

Identification - The most common foodborne illness caused by many species of bacteria. It is usually acute onset of fever, diarrhea, blood, abdominal pain, often severe with occasional vomiting. Dehydration in adults and the elderly can be severe. Incubation period is 6-72 hours usually between 12-48 hours.

Reservoir - Eggs in domestic and wild animals including poultry, pigs, cattle, rodents, dogs and cats.

Transmission - Ingestion of the organism in food obtained from infected animals or contamination by feces from infected animals or people. Salmonella are found in contaminated vegetables and fruit, eggs, processed dairy, undercooked poultry products, raw milk and dairy products and foods prepared by infected food personnel.



Campylobacter Infections

Identification - All species shown caused by Campylobacter jejuni or C. coli and occasionally C. coli. Symptoms include diarrhea, bloody stools, abdominal pain, fever, nausea and vomiting. Symptoms may occur 2-5 days after exposure and persist for 4 weeks.

Reservoir - Poultry, cattle and other animals such as sheep, swine, horses, other birds, rodents, fish, insects and birds. Most are poultry but not common.

Transmission - Ingestion of the organism in undercooked meat, contaminated water and food, raw milk, farm animals, poultry, infectious dose is low. Person to person transmission is possible but not common.

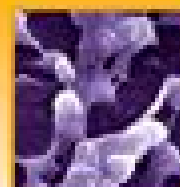


Listeriosis

Identification - A disease which is caused by Listeria monocytogenes and is usually fatal. Symptoms include fever, muscle aches, and confusion. It is usually fatal. Symptoms may occur 2-4 weeks after exposure and persist for 4 weeks.

Reservoir - Soil, sewage, sewage, and water. Animal reservoirs include infected wild and domestic animals. Food is 10% of the reservoirs. Food is L. monocytogenes is found in food but not in food.

Transmission - Ingestion of contaminated foods such as soft cheese, raw milk, vegetables, ready to eat meats and poultry. In neonatal infections, the bacteria is transmitted by the mother in utero or from passage through the birth canal.



Staphylococcal Food Intoxication

Identification - It is not an infection but is caused by the enterotoxins produced by Staphylococcus aureus. The disease is characterized by abrupt onset of vomiting, severe nausea, cramps, and prostration. Onset is within 1-6 hours. Food is contaminated and is usually in liquid or semi-liquid form.

Reservoir - Humans. About 10% of the population carries the bacteria. Usually only seen with infected wounds, dog and cat food.

Transmission - Ingestion of a food containing the enterotoxin. The food becomes contaminated with the bacteria via the food handlers' hands. At room temperature, the bacteria multiply and produce the enterotoxin. Can be found in staphylococcal food poisoning. Usually, food is not eaten, most products, most sandwiches, unprocessed cheese.



E coli O157:H7

Identification - Causes acute diarrhea with no fever. Incubation period is 2-7-10 days, most commonly 3-6 days. Diarrhea may be watery or bloody or stool or almost watery blood. About 80% of people having diarrhea caused by this organism progress to hemolytic uremic syndrome (HUS). Infectious dose is very low. Children under 5 are at greatest risk for developing HUS.

Reservoir - Cattle are the primary reservoir, although it is also found in dogs. Humans can serve as the reservoir for person to person transmission.

Transmission - Acquisition and the ingestion of food contaminated with resistant strains. Several outbreaks have been associated with petting farms, fairs, hamburgers, melons, sprouts, lettuce, soft-shell, spinach, apple cider, apricots, and processed milk. Person to person transmission occurs in families, institutional care facilities, and day care centers. Waterborne transmission occurs from drinking and recreational water.



Giardiasis

Identification - A protozoan infection that may be either asymptomatic, cause mild, self-limiting diarrhea, or chronic, frequent diarrhea with cramps, bloating and malabsorption of fats and vitamins resulting in weight loss and chronic diarrhea. It is a common cause of chronic diarrhea and is a leading cause of malabsorption of fats and vitamins. Reservoir - Humans and possibly beavers and other wild and domesticated animals.

Transmission - Contaminated water from the ingestion of food and water contaminated with protozoan cysts. Typical chlorine treatment of drinking water is not enough to killing the cysts. Chlorinated, contaminated recreational water can be a source. Person to person transmission occurs from transfer of cysts from infected people particularly in day care centers and institutions.

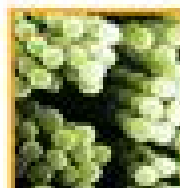


Norovirus

Identification - A viral infection that causes mild to moderate gastrointestinal illness with nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, abdominal pain, headache, malaise, and low grade fever usually lasts for 1-3 days.

Reservoir - Humans are the only animal reservoir.

Transmission - Spread through ingestion of contaminated food, water, or shell fish. Also contact with infected feces.



Aspergillus Infection

Identification - Can cause lung infection caused by fungi contaminated with various species of Aspergillus fungi. As the fungi grow, they produce aflatoxins and other mycotoxins that cause lung infection. The fungi grow in soil, food, and water. Growth may last for 1 day to 2 months.

Reservoir - Aspergillus fungi are ubiquitous and most common particularly in decaying plant material, compost piles, mold, and soil. Aflatoxin and mycotoxins production is variable and depends upon the type of Aspergillus species and environmental conditions.

Transmission - Airborne transmission of spores, ingestion and possibly inhalation of spores.
